### **PASTOR'S PEN**

Todays' gospel provides a very familiar scene from family life. A parent needs help. The elder child is all talk and no action. "Molly, clean your room." "Ok, I will Mom, I promise." Days later nothing has been cleaned. Or when asking a younger child for help the parent receives a defiant response. "No, I won't do it—it's not my job." But, in a short amount of time the child reconsiders and gets the job done.

Every day God is asking us to go into the world to build the Kingdom of God. Why? Because at the time of our baptism we became children of God and received the Light of Christ symbolized by the baptismal candle. Christ, the true Light of the world has entrusted us to be His Light in the world. Think for a moment about this past week. How did you respond to God's call to be the face, the hands, the ears and the heart of Jesus? How often did you share the Light of Christ?

Every Easter we renew our baptismal promises to turn away from sin so as to live in the freedom of the children of God. We promise to renounce Satan and to renew our belief in God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In a sense through the waters of baptism we become promise keepers; Children of God who fulfill the promises we made in baptism.

While we are in Church it is easy to say yes to all that God asks of us. The real challenge comes when we leave church and go out into the vineyard of our home, our place of work or play. All too easily we fall into the culture of unkept promises, a society that promises so much but often fails to deliver.

Can people count on us when we say, I'll pray for you...but we never get around to praying. Or to say, "I'll check in on you," and never stop by to visit. Have I respected the dignity of life that is found in each person or am I consumed with my own wants and desires? In the letter to the Philippians we heard: "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interest, but also for those of others. This is what it means to be the Light of Christ. Fulfilling the promise to die to self so that God may be glorified.

Do you remember the children's book by Dr. Seuss entitled "Horton Hatches the Egg? Maysie, a lazy mother bird is tired of sitting on her egg and wants a vacation. Horton, a full-sized elephant, passes by Maysie and she calls out to him from her nest begging Horton to take her place. She promises that she won't be gone long, "I give you my word." Reluctant at first, Horton agrees to sit on the egg. Well, as time goes by Horton nearly freezes through winter, is mocked and deserted by friends, captured by hunters and displayed in a traveling circus. Throughout the entire ordeal, Horton proclaims, over and over, through every trial, "I meant what I said, and I said what I meant, an elephant's faithful one hundred percent!"

The Light of Christ inspires us to a higher calling. Even if others let us down and do not fulfill their promises we are not excused from keeping our promises. As our friend Horton said, "I meant what I said and I said what I meant, I am called to be faithful one hundred percent!" Relationships are built upon trust and trust is built upon promises kept. That is why every promise kept increases the Light of Christ in our world because God is always faithful to God's promises.

Thankfully, when we do fail to live up to our promises, God is merciful and is ready to remove the darkness of sin so that we can live in the Light of Christ. Today, as we are sent into the vineyard of home or work or play may we draw strength from the Body and Blood of Christ we receive and remain true to our promise to be the Light of Christ in thought, word and deed.
