PASTOR PEN

This weekend we are given the opportunity to reflect upon the Spirit's gift of wisdom, a gift that enables us to see as God sees or as St. Thomas Aquinas says, "to have the view from the hill-top, from the standpoint of the highest cause." If we are honest, most of us live life from the standpoint of our own limited perspective or self-interest and get stuck in the drama and turmoil of day-to-day life. Our vision is blurred by fear, selfishness, envy, complacency, pride, impatience or spiritual immaturity.

A person seeking wisdom is nurturing an intimate relationship with God, one that strives to be in communion with Jesus by listening to His word of truth and putting that word into practice. St. James once wrote, "The wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere." (James 3:17)

In these final weeks of the church year, our attention is drawn to images of end times and our need to live in wisdom, to be prepared to meet the Lord when he comes in glory. The challenge is learning how to wait in hope.

St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians we heard today is the earliest writing we have in the New Testament, written around the year 50. The early Christians expected the Lord to come in glory in their lifetime. Since he had not returned, they began to doubt the promise Jesus made. Paul responds with a word of hope saying, "Christ is Lord of the living and the dead." All who are baptized in Christ will share in his gift of eternal life. Our lives are changed forever because of this promise and how we live our lives must reflect our belief!

But waiting in hope is not easy. Like the early Christians we can grow weary and anxious, and fail to be prepared for Christ, the Bridegroom to arrive. Today's parable of the ten bridesmaids highlights the need for each person to be prepared for the Lord.

At first glance we might think that those five wise virgins in Matthew's gospel were selfish. After all, as children we are taught the importance of sharing. Shouldn't the five virgins with plenty of oil have helped the five who were in need? Since parables carry layers of meaning let's look at the story from another angle.

The point Jesus wants to make is that there are some things we cannot do for others. For example, let's say I'm going to eat dinner for you today, so you don't have to waste time eating. Is that going to help satisfy your appetite? If I ask you to take a nap for me is that going to help me feel refreshed later in the day? No, there are some things we can't do for others.

So too, in the journey of faith, each person must make a commitment to follow the Lord. My spiritual preparations cannot take the place of your need to grow in your relationship with Jesus. We cannot transfer the good deeds we do to someone else. Each of us is responsible to use our God given time, talents and resources to build the Kingdom of God on earth; to bring the light of Christ into the world.

In today's parable we can look upon the lamp as the light of faith and the oil in the lamp as the wisdom that is nurtured through prayer, ongoing conversion, and the witness of our lives as we respond each day with the eyes and heart and mind of Jesus.

Wisdom teaches us that God's covenant of love is everlasting and that we must do our part in living that covenant of love in the here and now. With wisdom as our guide we need not fear death or judgement because wisdom will enable us to be alert and prepared for the day when Christ will come to take us to himself. Striving to be united with Christ, we can live joyfully in the present and live in hope of the life to come. Today, pray for wisdom and let this gift lead you to life.
