PASTOR'S REFLECTION

The presence of God is everywhere, so present that we can easily miss it. It's like putting sugar into a glass of water. Once dissolved, the sugar can't be seen but it is still in the glass. God is present in our waking, sleeping, eating, working, hurting, dying, playing, shopping, sitting, standing and breathing. Sorting out the voice of God among so many competing voices in our lives often takes another person to point the way; like Eli, directing Samuel or John the Baptist directing his disciples' attention to Jesus.

Two of John's disciples began to follow Jesus hoping to learn more about him. They must have invaded Jesus' personal space because he stops and asked the disciples, "What are you looking for?" They wonder where he is staying and Jesus responds, "Come and see." Rather than finding a place to stay, they found a home in Jesus. The disciples knew they had found what they were looking for, the Lamb of God, the Messiah.

When we foster a relationship with Jesus we are truly home. In Him we discover our true self and the call that God has placed in our hearts. We can always find a resting place in the heart of Christ. At the same time, Christ seeks to dwell in our hearts. That is why it is so important to remember what St. Paul points out in his letter to the Corinthians. He says, "Your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit." In baptism we are anointed with the Oil of Chrism, the oil of the Holy Spirit and we are dedicated as temples of the Spirit. Like sugar in water, we may not see it or recognize it—but this special consecration is still present.

Think for a moment about your body and what goes into your body, the food and the drink you consume. What goes into your body as you watch TV or surf the internet? What kind of language comes from your mouth or what thoughts do you entertain in your mind? Now recall the truth that at every moment of your life, God is dwelling within you.

St. Paul doesn't harp on rules or laws concerning the moral life, he approaches the question of immorality by recalling the dignity of the body as a temple of God's Spirit. If I eat or drink too much I am desecrating God's temple. If I view pornography or gossip or use foul language I am not honoring the dignity that is mine as a child of God.

Does the thought of God dwelling within you embarrass you? Then it's time to make a change in life. If the thought of God dwelling in you challenges you to do better, then it is time to act. If the thought of God dwelling within you stirs joy and peace within you then you must share the life of Christ your experience with others.

Like John the Baptist and Andrew we cannot simply keep our encounter with Jesus to ourselves...it is meant to be shared so that others can come to know the gift we have received. This week don't forget to listen for God's voice. As Rabbi Abraham Heshel notes: "The way to God is the way of God."

Respect Life January 22nd Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children". "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. One example is the *9 Days for Life* is a novena for the protection of human life. Devotion to Mary spread like wildfire and millions of medals were made in just a few short years. The devotion continues today.
