Reflection for 2nd Week of Lent

While reflecting upon the Transfiguration of Jesus Bishop Robert Barron noted, "If Jesus is only divine, then he doesn't touch us; if he is only human, then he can't save us." The Transfiguration of Jesus reminds us that both natures of Jesus are integrally bound together in God's plan of salvation.

The gift of the Transfiguration of Jesus is a wonderful mystery. In that experience, the human Jesus received the assurance of the Father's love and the divine Jesus revealed to the apostles that the Father and the Son are one and that the passion and death of Jesus are part of God's plan for our salvation.

For all of us, the Transfiguration reveals God's dream for all humanity. The eyes of the apostles were opened so they could see Jesus as human and divine. Their ears were opened to recognize the voice of the Father they heard deep in their hearts when Jesus called them to follow him. We too can be transformed if we follow the example of Jesus by offering ourselves for the good of others. The way of the world says, "It's all about number one, me." This is part of the devil's plan, to pit us against one another, to create division. Jesus taught us to put others before ourselves.

Being a faithful person is not an easy path to walk. Consider the faith of Abraham. He listened to the Lord's call to leave his homeland and to find a new home. After many years of waiting, Abraham and Sarah conceive a son, Isaac. Now Abraham hears God asking him to sacrifice his son, his dream, his promise. Consider the faith of Isaac. He was asked to carry the wood of the sacrifice upon his own back up the mountain. He trusted his father unconditionally. The practice of human sacrifice was common among the Canaanites during the time of Abraham. What is unusual is that God sees the depth of their faith and stops the sacrifice and Isaac lives.

We see in this story the journey that Jesus will make as he freely carries the cross on his shoulders up Golgotha to be crucified. God the Father allows his beloved son to be crucified for the salvation of the world. Thankfully, death does not have the last word. Christ is raised in glory which is what the Transfiguration reveals to us.

In the moment of the Transfiguration, the apostles were confronted with their own imperfections and sinfulness and were fearful of being in the presence of the Almighty. Soon this experience of fear and wonder became for them a glimpse of what will be in the glory of God's Kingdom. This vision would be a gift for them when the shadow of the cross entered their lives. Even though they still had a lot of growth to experience, over time they were becoming more and more committed to Jesus, they were becoming more like Jesus.

Each Sunday when we gather for Mass, for the Eucharist, we experience a vision of heaven. We though many are united in one voice of prayer and praise of God, we are inspired by the Word of God and we are nourished by real food from heaven. Through these experiences we are being transformed more and more into the image and likeness of Jesus. As such, we are to be the living presence of Christ in the world today being willing to sacrifice self for the sake of the other.

Lenten Pilgrimage: A Journey Through the Archdiocese Brown County, 1837, St. Mary, Arnheim, 6647 Van Buren St., Georgetown, OH 45121. http://ohiocatholic.homesteadcloud.com. Catholic families originally settled in the area around Arnheim, Ohio as early as 1827. Missionary priests celebrated Masses in homes until the first resident pastor, from the Benedictine order, was installed in 1882. He was from the St. Bernard Abbey in Cullman, Ala. The first church was built in 1838 and the current one in 1858. Women religious from the Ursulines and Glenmary orders served the educational needs of the parish. On a historical note in 1863, during the civil war, the church was spared when Morgan's Raiders swept through Arnheim; however, the town never fully recovered. On January 9, 1965 Bishop Sylvester Rosencrans blessed the church in the name of St. Mary.

Butler County, 1853, St. Mary Campus Ministry, Oxford, www.stmox.org. St. Mary's was first served by Rev. Jeremiah O'Connor (1853-1864). He organized the parish by purchasing a schoolhouse, that was to be converted to the church, on Poplar and Collins Streets. The church was dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1867. According to the Archdiocesan Archivist, the histories imply, that at its founding, German Catholic's were the Primary ethnic group. In 1917 it was destroyed by fire. In 1920 the larger church was built towards the center of town to serve the growing number of urban families and students from Miami University.
