FR. MATT'S REFLECTION

Video cameras are all around us these days, I mean just pull out your phone and press record and you have a video. But I grew up in the era before cell phones and if you wanted to video record something you needed a specific camera. I do not remember every detail about these cameras, but I do remember that you would put a blank VHS tape in the camera, record your video, and then later you would take the VHS tape out of the camera, put the VHS in the VCR, rewind the VHS back to the beginning and then you could watch whatever you recorded. Unofficially, I think these videos are referred to as "Home Videos". When I was about nine years old my parents bought one of these video cameras and at first I was a little excited. Mom or Dad would record things that our family would do like stand in front of the camera and sing a song, a birthday celebration, some every day fun in the sun, or better yet, a recording at Christmas time when gifts from Santa Claus where opened. I think we even have on tape my brothers and I wrestling together. These were special moments to catch on the camera, and it is fun to go back and reminisce about the past and watch these videos. But, I must admit after watching the first recording that I did, I do not like to watch these videos over again. I mean the video has caught me doing things that in hind sight I'm not proud of...nothing bad, but I still see my actions at times were rather foolish, stupid, and kind of embarrassing.

In our scriptures today we read that the disciples are hiding behind closed doors in fear. In fear that the Jewish leaders had arrested and put to death their Master, Jesus, and now they are gathered in fear wondering if they would be next. They are in fear, but I would imagine that they feel foolish, slightly stupid, and slightly embarrassed as well. If there was a video camera on Jesus, it would have caught them telling Jesus that they would never leave him, even if that meant dying with him. The camera would have also caught the moment of truth, when they came to arrest Jesus, the disciples did not stay with Jesus but they ran away in fear. In their fear, I would imagine the disciples are replaying the events that happened in their heads and also in the conversation that they are having with each other. There may not have been a physical camera but certainly they have the mental home video in their minds that is being replayed over and over.

In the midst of this fear, foolishness, and embarrassment Jesus comes and appears to the disciples. He does not scold them by saying, "Where were you?" or remind them that they were going to stick by his side and die with Jesus when they came to arrest him. He didn't say, "Peter, you said that you would never deny me, but I told you that you were going to deny me three times and you did," or "Since you couldn't be there when I needed you most, you are no longer my disciples." Rather than condemning or making the disciples feel more foolish, Jesus does the exact opposite. Jesus appears and says "Peace be with you." (John 20) Jesus offers the gift of his peace and forgives them for not being there. He says the past is the past, let's move forward into a new future.

As we look back on the past whether physically recorded or mentally recorded in our minds we may have a past that we not necessarily proud of. But because of Jesus's cross and resurrection we're forgiven our sinful past. Jesus gives us his peace, and invites us to move forward into new future.

Lenten Pilgrimage: Greene County, 1849. St Bridget Church, 258 Purcell Dr., Xenia 45385, www.stbrigidxenia.org
The first Mass in Xenia was in 1844. The growing Catholic community was organized as a formal parish under the patronage of St. Michael in August of 1849. The first pastor was Rev. Fr. James Kearney. In 1851 Rev. Thomas Lake renamed the parish in honor of St. Brigid of Ireland. After serving as a place of worship for 122 years the original St. Brigid's church, rectory, Sisters of Charity convent, and the West Second Street school were destroyed by the 1974 Xenia Tornado. A new St. Brigid Church was constructed on Fairground Road and dedicated in 1977. Since that time, a parish campus has evolved.
