DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

The Sacrament of the Present Moment

Our world isn't what it used to be. Everything has been turned up-side down. Things seem to be out of control; and even being out of control seems to be out of control. Nothing is what we expected, wanted, or hoped it would be. This must have been something like what the Apostles and disciples felt after Our Lord's crucifixion and death. Their world was shattered and I'm sure they saw no conceivable way how things could return to what they expected, wanted, or hoped they would be. But then came the glorious Resurrection of Our Lord. And though Our Lord plainly taught the Apostles about his coming death and subsequent resurrection, this extraordinarily joyful miracle, too, was unexpected and hardly something they dared hope for. Quite naturally, they were overjoyed and in awe at the sight of Jesus standing before them again. And it seems only natural as well, that they might have thought things would pick up where they had left off; with Our Lord leading the disciples on mission as he had before; that what they had expected, wanted, and hoped for might become a reality after all! But that wasn't in the Lord's plan.

We are prone to the same thing, aren't we? We want our life, our family, our culture, and our country to be thoroughly Christian. That is the way we expect, want, and hope it to be – that is the way it should be. And we become disillusioned, discouraged, or even angry when that doesn't happen; when it doesn't turn out that way. Like the Apostles we ask, "Lord, are you at this time going to fix all this?" And when Our Lord does not do so in the time we have allotted to him, often we retreat into romanticizing or even living in the past; or perhaps we place our hope in the inevitability of future progress, the god of our culture. But do you see the fallacies and errors in this most common of human conditions? There are at least two.

First, we have put all the burden, as it were, on Our Lord. "Lord, when are you going to do this or that?" as if Our Lord, heretofore, had done nothing for us: His Incarnation, Passion, Crucifixion, Death, and Resurrection, notwithstanding! Second, it is as if we, as disciples, have no part in the mission of Our Lord other than to assess how he is getting along; no power or obligation to participate in what he came to accomplish here on earth. But in fact that is exactly the opposite of what Our Lord tells us today at his Ascension, isn't it!?! For He said, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses, ...to the ends of the earth."

And what power does the Holy Spirit give us? The power to sanctify the present. For it is in sanctifying the present moment that we live out the mission of proclaiming the Gospel to every creature as Our Lord called us to. This has been called the Sacrament of the Present Moment by Jean Pierre de Caussade in the 18th century spiritual classic, Abandonment to Divine Providence.

Mother Angelica of EWTN fame had some advice on how to put this into practice by asking God, "What are you calling me to do right now? Not yesterday or tomorrow, but right now. God's will is manifested to us in the duties and experiences of the Present Moment. We have only to accept them and try to be like Jesus in them." You see, Mother continues, "God grants us actual grace for the moment, not the grace for tomorrow. If I live in the imagined pain of tomorrow with the grace I have now, I will always feel at a loss." Neither should we dwell in the past. "When you live in the Present Moment you do whatever must be done, then you drop it and move on. You don't dwell on the past, or on your past accomplishments. That's all over. Do it and drop it."

I'll conclude with a prayer by Saint Faustina through whom Our Lord gave us the Divine Mercy devotion:
O My God,
When I look into the future, I am frightened,
But why plunge into the future?
Only the present moment is precious to me,

As the future may never enter my soul at all.

It is no longer in my power to change, correct or add to the past;

For neither sages nor prophets could do that.

And so what the past has embraced I must entrust to God.

O present moment, you belong to me, whole and entire.

I desire to use you as best I can.

And although I am weak and small,

You grant me the grace of Your omnipotence.

And so, trusting in Your mercy,

I walk through life like a little child,

Offering You each day this heart

Burning with love for Your greater Glory.

Lenten/Easter Pilgrimage: Miami County, 1843, St. Mary Church, 310 S. Downing St, Piqua, OH 45356, www.piquaparishes.org. Piqua has a long and rich American Story going back to before the revolution but the first Europeans to settle there was an Irish family named Johnson. In the early 1840's it became clear to the Catholic community in Piqua that a church building was needed. Again Bishop Purcell was instrumental in the effort and a lot was purchased for \$80. Rev. Hallinan, the first pastor, led the early building effort but in 1845 Rev. James Cahill oversaw the completion of the structure. According to the newspaper reports from Bishop Purcell "it was a new and magnificent brick church, which would be an ornament to my parish in my diocese." The church was dedicated in 1846 by the Bishop and Rev. Daniel Hallinan and Rev. P. O'Meally. Over the years continual improvements have been made but the church building, which was completed in 1899, still stands on the original lot.
