FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Seldom do we experience the large gushing winds of Pentecost as described in our reading from the Acts of the Apostles. Usually, the Holy Spirit will work in little gusts that can change our life a little at a time. Unfortunately, we often brush these invitations for transformation aside either because we're too busy or we're preoccupied with our own agendas. For example, I can experience the Holy Spirit simply in the extra pause I give while reading a magazine and find myself touched by the suffering of the homeless or the loss that comes with another victim of violence. That sudden pause over something that catches our eye or the voice inside of us that leaves us pondering is often the breath of the Holy Spirit seeking to move us into action.

- Maybe it is an invitation to check the way I am treating others or asking myself if my behavior contributes to a culture of violence.
- Maybe it is the sight of an amazing sunset that leaves us speechless, and we become aware of the beauty of God at work in creation. This experience leaves us wondering if we are good stewards of God's creation.
- Maybe a chance line on a sign or a quote we read sticks with us and it becomes the mantra we hold onto for the day or throughout a challenging time in life.

I think of one experience I had while visiting a church near Gloucester, MA. In the back of the church I saw a poster which said, "The life of every human being first began in the heart of God." This line stayed with me the rest of the week and became a source of reflection for me as I wrestled with some challenging relationships.

In helping you to pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit I have included a prayer adapted from the writings of Pope Leo XIII, July 31, 1897. He wrote the prayer as a novena, but it can be used as a daily reflection for personal growth.

Prayer for The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Spirit of Wisdom preside over all my thoughts, words and actions, so that in all things I may love God for His own sake above all things. Amen. V. Holy Mary, Seat of Wisdom, R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Understanding teach and enlighten me so that I may never waver in my faith but enjoy true peace of mind and heart. V. Holy Mary, Queen of Peace, R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Knowledge teach me how to look at things in their true light, so that I may not be bound by earthly attachments, but ever rejoice in Your heavenly comforts. V. Holy Mary, Cause of our Joy, R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Counsel grant that I may always seek Your guidance, that my thoughts and actions may be informed by good judgment, and that whenever my advice is sought by others, it will be offered with kindness, prudence, truth, and in accordance with God's will. V. Mother of Good Counsel R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Fortitude strengthen my weakness, so that I may never be discouraged by obstacles in the path of holiness and virtue but may willingly accept the trials and difficulties of this life. V. Holy Mary, Queen of Martyrs, R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Piety implant in my soul filial love toward God my heavenly Father, and brotherly love for all, so that I may delight in the service of God and my neighbor. V. Mother of God, our Mother, R. Pray for us.

Spirit of Holy Fear keep me mindful of the infinite Majesty of God, keep me from all selfish desires and evil actions, that I may humbly serve God and others with a clean heart and clear mind. V. Immaculate Mary, Help of Christians, R. Pray for us.

Lenten/Easter Pilgrimage: Shelby County, 1838, St Michael Church, 33 Elm St., Ft. Loramie OH, 45845. www.nflregion.org The Ft. Loramie area dates back to 1749 when the French explorer Pierre-Joseph Celoron and his detachment made camp along the Loramie creek. It was here that the French Chaplain Fr. Joseph Peter Bonnecamps said, what is suggested to be, the first Mass in the Archdiocese. The ensuing years brought both Native American's and Settlers to the area. The growing Catholic community built the first log church in 1838 as a mission church from Minister. The first pastor of St Michael's was Rev. Wilhelm Bigot assigned in 1874 and was given the task of building a church for the growing German community. The new church was consecrated on October 2, 1881 By Bishop Elder. An interesting story is that the statues for the church were ordered from Europe. However, the ship bringing them sank and all was lost.

Preble County, 1853, Visitation Church, 4070 E. Main St., Eaton, OH 45320, www.preblecountycatholic.org The first Catholic Masses in Eaton were held in a private home by Fr. Carey. In the History of Preble County Ohio, 1881, it notes that "Fr. O'Connor was located in that place and remained for a number of years". "A building was fitted up as a church and for a time the society was in a prosperous condition; but the interest flagged, and the financial support became less strong". After that, Masses were held at the home of Michael Ryan. Eventually Masses resumed on the upper floors of a building on Main St. The present church was built in 1879 and dedicated on August 24th. The Irish railroad workers and surrounding farmers were most likely parishioners during the founding of the parish. The 1879 building is still being used and has undergone several remodels, the last in 1956.

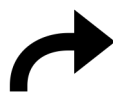

The Bishops of Ohio Announce the Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation

May 13, 2021

As we move beyond the worst of the coronavirus pandemic and access to the COVID-19 vaccine has become more widespread, the time has arrived for the good of all the faithful when the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is no longer necessary.

Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (CIC, can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have *significant* health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day (CIC, can. 1247) and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

The book of Exodus reminds us to keep holy the Sabbath day (Exodus 20: 8-10). As Catholics, we are invited by God to gather together in community, and participate fully in the Sunday Eucharist, which is the "source and summit of the Christian life." "Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2182).

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is not something God asks of us out of his own necessity to be worshipped, but rather a gift to the faithful for their spiritual well-being, eternal salvation and formation in our relationship with God and one another. To that end, Saint John Vianney rightly asserts, "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." The Eucharist is the greatest gift Christ left to the Church—the gift of Himself. There is no substitute for Mass celebrated in person.

We are profoundly grateful to our pastors and all of the faithful for their flexibility, fidelity and great generosity in support of the mission of the Church throughout this unprecedented time. As we prepare for the reinstatement of the obligation to attend Mass, we are excited once again to gather together in person without restrictions in our parish churches, most fittingly on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As we reflect on our Lord's goodness and mercy in the midst of the sacrifices made during the coronavirus pandemic, we ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us, that through his fatherly protection and care, we may experience a renewal of faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.




