FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

In the children's book Alice in Wonderland, Alice asks the cat for directions. "Would you tell me, please, which way I ought to go from here?" The cat replied, "That depends a good deal on where you want to get to." "I don't much care where," said Alice. "Then it doesn't matter which way you go," said the cat. In a sense the cat is telling Alice, if you don't know where you are going, then any road will take you there.

This is an important message for us as we live in a world that resists acceptance of eternal truth; that there are foundational principals to life which have been given to us by God to help us along our journey to the dwelling place God has prepared for us. One such example is the 10 Commandments which are the context for our First Reading today. God revealed himself to this group of slaves he freed from Egypt and gave them a new identity as God's chosen people. To ritualize this covenant agreement Moses takes half the blood from the animal sacrifice and splashed it on the altar, the other half was sprinkled on the people. Just as God had protected the people who sprinkled the doorpost and lintels of their homes with the blood of the sacrificial lamb, so too he was strengthening them now by this new covenant.

Why would Moses use blood to seal the covenant? It sounds a bit gross sprinkling people with blood! Just for a moment, let's put ourselves in the mind of the Israelite people. They didn't have all the medical advancements we have today. For them blood was seen as containing the very essence of life. Recall the words from the Book of Leviticus, "The life of a living body is in its blood." When blood stayed within a living body the creature lived. When blood was shed and flowed outside the body the creature died. So, in their thinking, blood contained the very essence of life and could serve as a powerful means of communication between two unequal worlds, heaven and earth.

In the fullness of time God sent his Son, Jesus, to teach us how to live, so that we could be a living sign of what it means to love unconditionally. As we heard in the Letter to the Hebrews, Christ came as High Priest of the good things to come. Here, the author is comparing Christ to the High Priest who entered the Holy of Holies in the Temple on Yon Kippur, the day of Atonement, the Day of Reconciliation.

By breaking the cycle of violence and embracing the cross, Jesus offered himself as the altar and the lamb of sacrifice, he is both the victim and the victor. Jesus gave us his Body and Blood as the new and eternal covenant. His blood restores humanity to right relationship with God and with all people and opened the door to eternal life.

In our journey of life, it is important that we remember where we are going because there are many temptations and distractions that are working to steer us away from our heavenly homeland. We believe that through the words of consecration and the power of the Holy Spirit, the bread and wine offered at Mass become the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is not a symbol or a sign of His presence, but THE living presence of Christ with us.

If a person does not know or care where they are going in life, then a simple Happy Meal of a hamburger, fries and a drink is good enough meal for them today. But if you desire everlasting life and a heart that gives unconditional love then it is essential that you come to the table of the Lord to be nourished with the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. This awesome gift we receive is food from heaven strengthening us as we journey to our eternal home.

No new live training through SafeParish will be required if you have completed live child protection training through VIRTUS. Ongoing child protection training will still be required for all volunteers and employees and will consist of quarterly interactive video-based training instead of monthly bulletins. As the archdiocese moves closer to the conversion date, additional information regarding your new SafeParish account will be provided. 
