

FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Last week our gospel reading showed Jesus feeding five thousand men with five barley loaves and two small fish, a spectacular miracle, a sign of the Kingdom of God in their midst. Yet, instead of a desire to develop a deeper faith, the crowd follows after Jesus looking for more food. It's like my great nephew who just finished his lunch and then asks his Mom "What's for supper?" Our physical hungers are only temporarily satisfied.

We can hardly blame the people who were hoping that there was a solution to their pressing problem of having enough to eat. We have supermarkets, fast food restaurants and modern refrigeration and so it is difficult for us to imagine the lack of security that dominated the daily experience of the people. Food was never plentiful and so, securing enough for your family was a top priority each day.

Jesus was trying to help the people to see that He has so much more to offer than just a temporary fix to their hunger issues. He is not a generous baker distributing free food for the people. He is offering himself as the Bread of Life! That is the sign, to believe in Him as God's Son.

At this point in the teaching of Jesus there is no reference to eating His flesh and drinking His blood, that will come later. Today's reading focuses on our belief in Jesus as the Son of God. This is key because we can easily see our reception of Holy Communion as something that we do as a force of habit, where we just go through the motions of coming up for communion with no intention of changing our lives. Jesus is saying, "Just as bread gives life to those who eat, so too, I give life to those who believe." Jesus is saying, "Your deepest need is not for the things God provides; your deepest need is for God."

So often when we are confronted with the challenges of life, our true character is revealed. Just like the people of God who struggled in the wilderness, we are often weak, wavering and grumbling. The people ask Moses and Aaron: "Why did you lead us out here to this God forsaken place?" So, what does God do for them? God provides them with food, not the kind of food they are accustomed to, and it is certainly not the food they would have chosen for themselves and yet, it sustains them in the desert.

At times in our lives, we ask God for help and God sends us manna and yet we may not recognize the nourishment we are being given to help us. Maybe God sends us manna in the desert of our lives in the form of a family member or friend who gives us guidance for an important decision. Maybe the manna comes in the beauty of nature or the arts which nourishes our soul. Maybe the manna comes in some stories from the past that remind us of our roots and that we belong to a family. This week I encourage you to reflect upon the manna that God is providing for you each day that nourishes and strengthens your spiritual life.

Even though Jesus speaks of Himself as the Bread of Life, He is not yet speaking about the sacrament of the Eucharist. He's laying the groundwork for the gift He will leave during the Last Supper meal. The Israelites want to do the work of God and they expect Jesus to give them a list of rules to follow just like the scribes and Pharisees did. But, Jesus offers them a much bigger challenge. They are expected to "believe", to believe that He is the promised one of God and as God's Son they are to accept His teachings and the example of His sacrificial love.

Through our journey in life God is shaping us more and more into a community of believers who trust God above all things. As St. Paul reminds us we are to put on that new self, created in God's image and put away the old self of our former way of life and see that our deepest need is not for the things God provides; our deepest need is for God...for Jesus the Bread of Life.
