FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

In today's first reading we find the prophet Elijah at his wits end! He was worn out and tired of being hunted by Queen Jezebel's men. Right before today's reading Elijah had made a mockery of the 450 prophets who worshiped the numerous Canaanite gods, proving the God of Israel was the one true God. Elijah put the false prophets to death and now Queen Jezebel is hunting him down to put him to death. Elijah says: "This is enough O Lord. Take my life." You might be thinking, is this the thanks Elijah gets for being a messenger of the Lord?

I would guess that all of us at one time or another have had this kind of Elijah experience in our lives; those times when the burdens and crosses of daily life become too heavy. We try to do the work of God and still have many forces working against us and battles to fight. Then comes the temptation to fall into doubt and despair, and like Elijah we are ready to give up.

There are other times, like in today's gospel, when we encounter something in life that just doesn't make sense to us, and we start to murmur and question Jesus like the Jews who said they knew His father and mother. They ask, "How can He come down from heaven?" It's like Jesus asking you to forgive someone and you murmur, "I won't forgive them until they say they are sorry." What He is asking is too much to accept.

In the spiritual life, questions and doubts are not necessarily bad, if reflected upon, they can become the passageway to a new awareness and an invitation to grow in faith. Jesus is offering us an important teaching today. He says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

When we want to give a gift to someone, which gift do you think will be appreciated the most, a gift that was purchased and delivered or a gift in which you offer to give your very self—your time, your presence or your attention to another person? Jesus gives us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist and He uses the image of bread to make it clear that it is His life that feeds us. Giving His flesh for us to eat is a sacrificial offering that will necessarily take him to the cross. If we are to remain strong in our journey to eternal life we will need to find strength in His life and the nourishment He gives to us through his Body and Blood.

When we live in union with Christ we should not be surprised when suffering enters our life. Being a true follower of Jesus means that we pattern our life after the life of Jesus. Just as He had to endure tireless challenges, rejection and physical suffering we too must be ready to die to self so that others might have life.

In our second reading today, St. Paul is writing to the people of Ephesus while he is in prison in Rome. He has every reason to give up, to be angry for being imprisoned for his faith. Yet, what did he tell us? "Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed from you. Be kind, compassionate and forgiving as God has forgiven you in Christ."

If we believe that Jesus is the Bread of Life then our lives cannot remain unchanged when we receive him in Holy Communion. Our lives must reflect the life we share in Christ. The food that will sustain us is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, true food from heaven. Nothing else will do. It is this food that gives us the strength to keep going in the face of the cross and the sacrifices of life. Keeping our focus on Jesus and being nourished with His Body and Blood we are fortified with what we need to continue our journey in faith and to one day share in His gift Eternal Life.


