FR. MATT'S REFLECTION

They say that young children are easily influenced by what they see and hear. Some may say that are boys are more easily influenced than girls; whether that is true, I will leave up for debate. I would argue that adults at times are just as easily influenced by what they see and hear. When we see a behavior that sparks our attention, or when we do something that sparks someone else's attention, it is bound to be copied, another name for this might be copycat crime. Or when we are around another person or group of people for a significant amount time, they rub off on us—we might pick up a habit of theirs or repeat one of their phrases. And this can be both good and bad, just a note of caution to monitor your behavior, also a word of warning about the friends that you keep.

I am not sure if I influence other people's behavior. But I will admit that I can easily be influenced by others. For example, when I was growing up, I liked to pretend that I was a priest, and I would pretend to have Mass. Even today, in my real life as a priest for a little over three years, I look to priests who are role models for me and I try to be like them.

Jesus begins his public ministry by proclaiming the kingdom of God, driving out demons, and healing those who were sick. As he begins his ministry, he called the disciples Peter, James, John, and rest of the nine to come follow him. They followed him and became witnesses to Jesus' ministry. They heard Jesus' message and they watched Jesus heal the sick and drive out demons.

As they journeyed, did they get inspired to want to do what Jesus did, to drive out demons, heal the sick, or preach the Kingdom? Whether they got inspired is not known, but we know that "He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits" (Mark 6:7). And they preached, healed and drove out demons. And their ministry must have been inspiring to others who followed their example.

In our Scriptures today, John reports to Jesus about trying to prevent someone from driving out demons who was not one of Jesus' disciples. Jesus instructs John to "not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me" (Mark 9:39).

The disciples in their ministry inspired one another to drive out a demon in Jesus' name. In the way that we live our lives as disciples of the Lord, we are called also to drive out demons, heal the sick and proclaiming the Kingdom of God. We are called to lives of prayer and caring for each other and the world. In doing this, we inspire others to want to do what we do, we inspire them to be one of us. As we inspire, may we welcome, teach and encourage those who wish to join us.

This article by Fr. Jan Schmidt, Director of Pastoral Vitality and Evangelization, is the final part of a series begun 09-12-2021 on the Beacons of Light pastoral planning process.

The makeup of the Families of Parishes will be announced on Wednesday, September 29th. From October 1-20th we enter a public review of the models. As a result of this input there may be some tweaking that needs to take place. Once the work is completed on the makeup of the Families and all of the important background data is compiled for each Family and the final maps prepared showing the territorial boundaries of each as well as the boundaries of the six newly defined deaneries the archbishop will approve and promulgate the plan...hopefully no later than Thanksgiving. It is then that the hard work begins.

Some have remarked that Beacons of Light is a "top down" plan. Well, this period of data collection and modeling certainly fits that bill. There was no other method by which to bring us to this point with every decision being based on data, on facts. Now the hard work really begins.

That "hard work" is the "bottoms up" phase of the plan, the pastoral planning that will take place within each family of parishes that will determine everything that must be considered for parish communities and their people to eventually come together as one great parish that possesses the resources necessary to assure a rich and fervent mission driven community who are ready to go out and "baptize all nations."

It is time to pray and to pray fervently that all will go well with our plan, that all people will see the necessity of what we must do and that all may grow together more closely so as to work and to minister with an eye on a fruitful and worthwhile outcome that builds our parishes into power houses of God's love and generosity. May God bless and keep us as we move into a new and exciting time in our lives as Catholics, in our lives as the Church of Cincinnati, in our lives as the People of God


