## **DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION**

Today is the Feast of Christ the King. This particular feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 due to the increasing influence of a philosophy known as secularism – a philosophy that excludes God from public life and whose key tenet is to think and act as if God did not exist.

It's easy to get frustrated and discouraged about this, isn't it? For our culture has embraced secularism, and the entirely predictable result is political discord, economic and social discord; crime has increased and in some cities is rampant, and public morality and a disregard for the sanctity of life has truly fallen to new lows.

But this feast proclaims to us and the world, that despite all this, Jesus Christ is the Lord and rightful ruler of all peoples, governments, leaders, and principalities; this feast reminds us that all authority in heaven and on earth is given by Him and subject to Him; it calls us to an ever-deeper level of commitment to God, to an ever-deeper level of faith and hope in Him as we look to the future.

Equally important is that the readings today clearly tell us that this same all-powerful Lord loves us deeply and has given us a mission. In the 2nd reading we read: "He who loves us has freed us from our sins by his blood, He has made us into a kingdom of priests for his God and Father." Our mission is to proclaim this good news to the world and let everyone know that Our Lord is real and wants to have a personal relationship with them. Our mission is to invite them to join us in worshipping Him in the Church Our Lord himself founded.

But it is hard to do that if we have lost sight of just how blessed we are; if we don't take the time to realize how wonderful the faith Our Lord has entrusted to us is. We are so blessed! We have the Sacraments which bring us untold graces that empower us to live out the faith we profess. And where else on earth can we find the Eucharist where we can see Our Lord, touch Him, taste Him and receive Him into our very bodies? And in addition to our prayers for each other, we have the Communion of the Saints, literally praying us into heaven every moment of our lives.

And you know, the reality we see here on earth, what we think of as real, that is, the material world...we think this is as real as it gets. Every good thing on earth, however good it is, is but a shadow of the real reality of the things in heaven. As real and as deep a parent's love for their child is, and real as the love they have for their spouse – that is but a faint reflection of the love we will experience in heaven.

And then there is our faith itself. The teachings of the Church, the doctrines, the moral truths God has revealed to us through his Church. This is THE one thing that first convinced me almost 40 years ago that I had found the Church Our Lord established, or should I say the Church found me? The continuity of our faith is astounding. What we believe today, the Apostles believed, the Mass we celebrate is the same Mass – the liturgy of the Word and the liturgy of the Eucharist. What other Church has refused to compromise on abortion, contraception, the dignity of the human person, life, and marriage? What other church defends the fundamental rights of religious freedom and the authority of the Church to speak to all moral issues of the day? Who has championed the cause of social justice and the care of the poor and oppressed more? I could go on and on...

But I'll close by encouraging you to be grateful to God for the rich heritage and faith we have been entrusted with. And why have we been entrusted with this? That we may know and love our Lord Jesus, that we may serve him in this life and be happy with him forever in the next. But we must never treat this faith as a private possession but as it truly is; a gift entrusted to us that we might bring that same holy faith to our neighbors and to those who don't know our Lord. That we might love them, as He loves us. We are on mission!

**Pray for Dobbs.** In the United States, abortion has taken the lives of over 60 million unborn children since 1973, and kills well over 600,000 each year. The United States is an extreme outlier in abortion law and policy, being one of only four countries – along with China, North Korea and Canada – that value human life so little that abortion of a child is permissible at any stage of a woman's pregnancy. The upcoming Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health could start to change that, as the court considers the question of whether it is constitutional to ban abortion at any point pre-viability. Oral arguments begin on Wednesday, Dec. 1. You are encouraged to participate in Mass, a holy hour, pray the rosary or offer other prayers around December 1st for this intention and to pray regularly in the coming months until the case is decided next summer.
