FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

A soap manufacturer and a pastor were walking together down a street in a large city. The soap manufacturer casually said, "The Gospel you preach hasn't done much good, has it? Just observe. There is still a lot of wickedness in the world, and a lot of wicked people, too!" The pastor made no reply until they passed a dirty little child making mud pies in the gutter. Seizing the opportunity, the pastor said, "I see that soap hasn't done much good in the world either; for there is much dirt still here, and many dirty people are still around." The soap man said, "Oh, well, soap only works when it is applied." And the pastor said, "Exactly! So, it is with the Gospel."

Today we hear from John the Baptist who is announcing a baptism of repentance. In this baptism, John was not converting Gentiles into Jews. His baptism was for Jews who had sinned and needed forgiveness. They needed repentance, to turn around and walk once again with God. John quotes from the Prophet Isaiah, "Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth." Isaiah is calling us to level the mountains of pride, selfishness and the desire to do our own will rather than follow God's will for us. He is calling us to fill in the valleys of discouragement, hopelessness and despair that steal our joy.

Another Advent prophet we hear from today is Baruch. He was the secretary of the prophet Jeremiah who accompanied the Jews to Babylon in their exile in the year 587 BC. Fifty years later the Persian emperor defeated Babylon and proclaimed that the exiles could go home. Baruch says, "take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of Glory from God." Baruch's words remind us in this Advent season to take off our robes of anger, cynicism, and fear and to put on the robes of mercy, kindness, justice, peace, and hope. Just as soap only works when it is applied, so too, we must apply the virtues of faith to our lives.

We have the benefit of living in the light of the Incarnation. Heaven came to earth in the person of Jesus Christ, and He has shown us the path of life. Through His Precious Blood, Jesus has purchased for us the price of our salvation, the forgiveness of sin and the promise of everlasting life. The season of Advent invites us to slow down, and to become more aware of the presence of God in our lives. Instead of focusing on the number of shopping days until Christmas the Lord desires for us to get rid of the obstacles that are affecting your relationship with Him and those around you. That is how we can best "prepare the way of the Lord."

In the depth of our hearts, we long for that new Jerusalem envisioned by the prophet Baruch, that place of peace, justice and truth. With so much news of violence, brokenness, bitterness and uncertainly in our world we may feel overwhelmed and struggle to keep hope alive. It is precisely at times like this that we are asked to dig deep into our hearts and hear the reassuring words of Jesus, "I am with you always, do not be afraid." Just as John the Baptist proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins we too are called to turn away from our sinful ways and "prepare the way of the Lord."

During this Advent season as we journey to the manger it is helpful to be aware of the obstacles that we encounter and to see them as opportunities for growth and greater trust in God. What we anticipate and long for in this holy season is not just the celebration of the event of the birth of Jesus, but the advent, the coming, of our salvation. Each time we respond to God's grace we catch a glimpse of what will be in the Day of the Lord and renew our hope in the promises that have been made by God which will be fulfilled when Christ comes again in glory.
