A Message from Archbishop Schnurr

In the Gospel reading today, Jesus begins his public ministry in Galilee by applying to Himself a message from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah that is hopeful rather than admonishing. The message is worth repeating because it applies to us as well. It says: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (*Lk 4:18-19, Is 61:1-2*).

That same Spirit that came upon Jesus also descended upon the Church at Pentecost and guides the Church to this very day. Moreover, the same Holy Spirit came upon each of us at Baptism when we became members of the Body of Christ. We are the Lord's eyes, ears, and hands in our time and place. From the earliest days of the Church that has meant taking care of those in need. For more than four decades, this Archdiocese has undertaken an annual appeal to enable members of the local Church to do together what we cannot do separately by financially supporting vital ministries that teach, feed, and heal in Christ's name. Today I invite you to take part in the 2022 Catholic Ministries Appeal.

The theme of this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal is based on a passage taken from the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of St. Matthew. The passage reads: "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." The good works of the six ministries supported by the Catholic Ministries Appeal assist the most vulnerable among us every day, including expectant mothers, the hungry, the elderly, those with mental health challenges, refugees, prisoners, and families.

All of them continued to be challenged by the COVID-19 pandemic over the past year, both in terms of demands from those they serve and in terms of their ability to deliver services. Many of our donors were undoubtedly challenged as well; and yet, last year's CMA campaign once again exceeded its fund-raising goal of \$5 million. On behalf of all of those who benefit from the good works of CMA-assisted ministries, I am profoundly grateful. This financial support allowed the ministries to respond with great creativity and determination to the challenging difficulties of the year.

Catholic Charities and Catholic Social Services, for example, showed that "pro-life" is not just a slogan. They continued to provide pregnancy counseling and post-adoption services as well as senior services, refugee resettlement, mental health counseling, and much more. They also reworked their food pantries and mobile food outreach to continue delivering meals to those in need while keeping everyone safe and healthy.

St. Rita School for the Deaf, like Jesus who made the deaf hear, still met the communication needs of its students, day in and day out in a year where interpersonal communication saw so many shifts and changes.

Our campus, hospital, and prison ministry chaplains found much of their restricted worlds affected by COVID-19. Yet they each creatively moved their missions forward as they cared for souls, proclaimed the Gospel, welcomed new members into the church, and celebrated the sacraments.

The Center for the New Evangelization continued to equip Catholics to become missionary disciples. This involved presenting training workshops in parishes; working directly with youth, young adults, and engaged couples; and offering programs for Catholic school teachers and staff.

This past May I had the great joy of ordaining seven young men to the priesthood and an additional seven young men to the transitional diaconate in preparation for priestly ordination later this year. All were formed through Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology, which receives support from the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

At the same time, our retired priests have generously continued to serve the Church with prayer and sacramental help to parishes, pastors, and the faithful of the Archdiocese despite the special risk posed to their age group by the pandemic.

We cannot know what challenges this year will bring us, but we do know that these CMA ministries will be an essential means through which our local Church will strive to address them. Please share in their good work through a gift to the CMA this year, whether or not you have donated previously. In the name of the thousands who will benefit materially and spiritually, I thank you for your generosity.




