FR. ANGLEO'S REFLECTION

Temptation is something that all of us are familiar with in the journey of life. Even Jesus was tempted! Following a rigorous 40-day spiritual retreat in the desert the devil was trying to lure Jesus away from his mission to fulfill the will of the Father by saving humanity from sin and death. The devil tempts Jesus and each of us to seek sinful pleasure, easy wealth, and a position of authority. Jesus is our model for overcoming temptations.

The devil is very good at attacking where we are most vulnerable. Jesus was hungry after his desert experience and so why not turn stones into bread? After all, he would turn water into wine and multiply loaves and fish. What is different here is that Jesus is being tempted to satisfy himself. The devil tempts Jesus to end his hunger pains, to stop his suffering. It's the lie that is so easily accepted, "If it feels good do it." We all have experienced desert times in our life, times when we have felt lost, empty, unfulfilled or disconnected from God. The devil tempts us to fill the pain with whatever will help us feel better by falling into addictive behaviors, finding solace on the internet, over-indulging in food or drink, choosing to be unfaithful to one's vocation, or stealing to get what you want...by all means stop the pain, take care of those bodily desires. Jesus says, "No."

The second temptation by the devil is to seek power for personal gain. The devil promises to give us power and authority if we but follow him. His goal is to get us to reject eternal life through pride and arrogance. Jesus could not turn away from God's plan of salvation for the world. His kingdom is not of this world; our true home is in heaven. When tempted what are you focusing upon? Are you keeping your eyes on Jesus or does the object of your temptation have your focus? Faith teaches us that we must be willing to surrender our power, to turn our will over to God. This is a lesson Jesus learned in the desert by keeping his eyes on the Father.

The third temptation Jesus faced was the desire to amaze others-after all, he is the Son of God. The devil wanted Jesus to throw himself off the temple so that angels would come and break his fall thus showing he was the Messiah. Being a miracle worker was not why Jesus came to earth. He came not to save himself but to save humanity. Jesus did not take the easy way out to prove he was the Son of God. No, he took our sins to the cross.

The devil will tempt us to take the easy way out, to go along with the current of the culture, to tempt us with a feeling of entitlement and prideful arrogance. During these times of temptation, it is important to ask, "Where is the true source of our power and authority?" All that we have is gift. Jesus remained true to the mission of his Father, to restore that relationship with God that was lost by original sin. In an act of unselfish love, he gave his life for our salvation.

We have begun our 40-day journey of Lent and we will be tempted like Jesus to give in to bodily desires; to seek power and control over others, to puff ourselves up thinking we are entitled to our blessings. The ancient spiritual practices of fasting, alms giving, and prayer are at the heart of being a disciple. Fasting helps us to battle our attachment to physical pleasure by taming our bodily desires. We give alms to correct our attachment to possessions, wealth, and

material items. We increase our prayer to overcome pride and to humble ourselves before God. The best way to turn away from temp-

tation is to keep our eyes on Jesus. This means taking time to really get to know Jesus, developing a relationship with him that nourishes and nurtures your heart, mind, and soul. The devil will be back to tempt us. Will you be ready to fight off the temptation?
