FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Cardinal Bernardin once told this story about a second-grade teacher who decided to put on an Easter play. All of the children were given parts, although some of the parts were quite insignificant. One boy, for example, was given the part of the stone that was placed in front of Jesus's tomb. The teacher told this child that when it was time for the stone to be rolled aside so that Jesus could rise from the dead, all he needed to do was to move his hands in a circle and then step to the side.

The first time they had a rehearsal, the boy got a running start and began to do a series of summersaults at the end of which he knocked down several children. The teacher took him aside and told him that it simply was not necessary to be so dramatic. It would be sufficient for him merely to move his hands in a circle and then step to the side.

At the next rehearsal, the boy did the same things—knocking the other children aside as he did his summersaults. The teacher decided that, rather than try to reason with him, she would offer him a different role instead. First, she offered him the part of one of the soldiers, but he replied that he wanted to be the stone! Then she offered him the part of Peter. He thought a little longer about this possibility; but again, he refused insisting that he wanted to be the stone!


Finally, in exasperation, she offered him the highly coveted role of Jesus himself. The boy gave this careful thought before telling her that he still wanted to be the stone! When she asked him why he insisted on being the stone, he proudly replied: "Because when I let Jesus out of the tomb, it feels so good!"

For 40 days of Lent, we have been following the ancient practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. During this journey we invited God to help us roll away the stone of our hardened heart, a stone that has kept us from encountering the Risen Lord and entombed the gifts of the Holy Spirit within us.

The most remarkable event in all of history is the resurrection of Jesus. This was not the mere resuscitation of a lifeless body that would die again like Lazarus, but the victorious rising of Jesus who lives forever. "Death no longer has power over Him." (Rom. 6:9) This truth powerfully affected the lives of the disciples. They became fearless and bold and focused on telling others about this most amazing gift that has been given to us.

Today, we are called to have the enthusiasm and joy of that little boy allowing the life we have received from Jesus to be freely shared. Can we allow the love of Jesus to move us beyond our fear, confusion, hurt and doubt? Easter calls us to live in the Light of Christ, a light that takes away all darkness. As we renew our baptismal promises today, we can't help but feel the joy of that little boy because our "yes" to these promises rolls back the stone of darkness and reveals Jesus, the Light of Life. May you experience the joy that comes from proclaiming the truth that Jesus is risen!


