DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

We've all heard the expression "Like a deer caught in the headlights." If a deer is crossing the road at night and sees the bright headlights of an approaching car, it will simply stop and stare at the oncoming disaster. Have you ever wondered what the deer is thinking as it stands there seemingly paralyzed? I can imagine the deer thinking, "If I just stand really still, that big bright thing coming towards me will go away..." or perhaps "What is the matter with me? I know what I need to do. Why don't I just jump out of the way?" In a similar way, we can imagine some of the apostles from today's Gospel hiding in the locked room thinking, "If I just stay here in this locked room, all those men who are trying to kill me will go away..." or perhaps "What is the matter with me? Just a few days ago I said I was willing to die with Jesus. I know what I need to do, why don't I just do it?" But unlike the deer who awaits the inevitable, the apostles experience something incredible: Christ himself appears among them and says "Peace be with you!" The disciples are overjoyed and Christ says again "Peace be with you!" What kind of peace did Christ grant them? Not a peace that says, "Don't worry because I will make it all go away," but rather, "Do not fear, I will give you the strength to endure and even rejoice in the trials you are to undergo." The peace Christ gives is, "not the kind of peace that makes us immune to pain, but the kind that enables us to triumph over it by uniting it to the victory of Christ himself." How different this peace is compared to the counterfeit peace the world promises.

Christ then breathed on the apostles and said "Receive the Holy Spirit." I would submit to you that God's breath is tied to creation – it is a creative act. When God created Adam and Eve, he breathed into them the breath of life. What then was Our Lord giving to the apostles when he breathed on them? He was giving them a new beginning, giving them in a special way the power of the Holy Spirit to remake them, as it were, into new apostles. Our Lord makes all things new! He transformed these timid, fearful men into bold, fearless apostles of Christ – almost every one of which became a martyr for the faith.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if Christ himself could breathe on us as he did on the apostles so we could boldly carry out that mission? Think of what a witness we could be for Christ! But the fact is, Christ has breathed on us just as he breathed on the apostles. The Catechism says, "Through the Church's sacraments, Christ communicates his Holy and sanctifying Spirit to the members of His Body!" "Through the Church's sacraments, Christ communicates his sanctifying Spirit to the members of the Church!" God breathes on us through the Sacraments! We do have the same Spirit as the apostles. We just need to give Him permission to do His work through us! Sometimes we get so used to the Sacraments, we forget the grace and power they have. We look for the extraordinary or miraculous as evidence that the Holy Spirit is working. However, Our Lord most often works using ordinary things in our lives to exhibit his extraordinary grace. Grace works through nature. Consider, for example, how in the Eucharist, we receive Our Lord's body, blood, soul and divinity, under the appearance of bread and wine. What is more ordinary than bread and wine...what is more extraordinary than receiving the body and blood of Our Lord?

After giving them His peace, Christ gave the apostles the power to forgive sins in His name. "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, whose sins you retain are retained." This shows how important the Sacrament of Reconciliation is. This also shows that reconciliation is essential to the success of our mission as Catholics. How can we announce the Resurrection of Easter, bear witness to Christ Our Savior, make present His Goodness through acts of charity, or spread the Good News of Salvation if we are paralyzed in the blinding headlights of unconfessed sin? Like the apostles paralyzed with fear before Our Lord breathed upon them, like a deer caught in the headlights, sin paralyzes our soul and prevents His grace from working in and through us. Thank God His divine mercy is greater than our sin.

Today we celebrate that wonderful mercy in Divine Mercy Sunday. The peace Christ gave to the apostles, the peace that gave them the

strength to heroically endure their trials is also available to us. Like the apostles we too can be transformed, recreated, given a new beginning. We do not have to be like the deer awaiting the inevitable; Our Lord has given us the means of escape. Our Lord, who is gentle and humble of heart, longs for us to be reconciled to him. Let us throw ourselves into the ocean of His Divine Mercy.


