



## FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

This weekend we are given another opportunity to reflect upon an encounter with the Risen Lord. The disciples had returned to Galilee and were trying to get back to a normal life. Even though they had recently encountered the Risen Lord behind locked doors, they just couldn't imagine Him every trusting them again. Put yourself in their shoes. Have you ever let someone down? It's hard to face that person again because you not only disappointed them but you also disappointed yourself.

Finding it hard to believe that Jesus could ever trust them again, the disciples go back to what was most familiar to them...fishing. Recall what several of the disciples were doing when they first met Jesus as told in Luke's gospel. They had worked all night and caught nothing, so they were mending their nets along the shore. Jesus comes along, tells them to lower their nets again and soon their nets were tearing with the weight of so many fish. Well, a lot has happened since that first call! Now the Risen Jesus instructs them to lower their nets and they catch 153 large fish. Some say this number is in reference to the number of known nations in the world at that time. In other words, with this catch Jesus wants the disciples to return to their vocation of gathering people into the net of God's love rather than simply catching fish.

While on shore, Jesus takes on the familiar role of servant, just as He had done at the Last Supper when He prepared the Passover meal for His disciples. Jesus wants the disciples to see that failure is a part of life. We must learn from our mistakes and continue the journey God has in mind for us. Nobody is a failure unless they quit trying. In this scene, Jesus is working to restore the disciple's identity as children of God through the gift of His reconciling love. By inviting the disciples to bring some of the fish they had just caught to the meal He was preparing, Jesus is helping the disciples to see that they have an important role to play in continuing His mission. He will be working through them and when they listen to him and follow His commands there is great abundance.

But the journey of reconciliation is not finished with the meal. Have you ever heard someone say, "Hey, the problem won't be solved until we address the elephant in the room?" Well, that's what Jesus begins to do as he questions Peter and their relationship. "Peter, do you love me?" Jesus is addressing the lie in which Peter denied knowing Jesus. The three questions are in a sense a ritual way of undoing Peter's three denials, helping Peter to forgive himself and to reconcile him with the community. Jesus is saying that Peter is still the rock upon which the community of believers is to be built.

This resurrection account is a beautiful story of the gift of God's mercy. Jesus recognizes the broken relationships and the disciple's inability to understand reconciliation and forgiveness. And so, Jesus, the victim, prepares an environment of welcome and hospitality so that reconciliation can take place. In the Christian understanding of forgiveness, the victim always takes the first step to healing. By providing a familiar meal and listening to their story, Jesus heals the stinking thinking of the disciples by reminding them that love is stronger than sin and death. What's most important is their love for Jesus! If Jesus forgives them, now they must forgive themselves & others. In turn, they are to share the Good News of the Father's love and mercy to the whole world.

This is our call as well. Even if we fail at being disciples at times, the love of God will heal us and Jesus will say once again, "Come follow me." Believe it or not, as our relationship with Jesus grows, one day we will even be able to rejoice in being found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name of Jesus and it will all be worth it for an eternity of glory. May we be an Easter people who follow the example of Jesus as ministers of reconciliation in our families, community and world today.
