DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

More than meets the eye!

Can you imagine being with our resurrected Lord during the 40 days prior to his Ascension? How incredible that would have been! To listen to him teaching and answering questions, following him to Bethany, hearing his final words, and then watching Him ascend triumphantly to take his place where He was before, at the Father's right hand.

But, as incredible as that would have been, our faith is even more incredible than it seems! You see, nothing in the Bible is insignificant, especially when it comes to Our Lord! Not only what he says, but also what he does, as well as where and how he does it signifies a sacred truth he is trying to teach. Let's dive deeper into the significance of the events leading up to the Ascension, when we do, we will see the Ascension in a new light, one that makes it all the more glorious!!!

That the Lord spent 40 days teaching the disciples and answering their questions is itself significant. Anytime you hear the number 40 in the Bible, it is meant to bring to mind the 40 years Israel was in the desert. During that time, Old Testament Israel was just starting to learn how to listen to and obey God through Moses. In just the same way, Our Lord spent the 40 days after the resurrection teaching the disciples about himself and the way of faith; getting the disciples ready to claim their inheritance as sons and daughters of God, an inheritance that included the honor of bearing witness to him to the world. And we are the fruit of their faithfulness to their inheritance!

Throughout the entirety of his earthly ministry Jesus not only pointed his disciples to the heavenly kingdom, he emphatically and repeatedly told them that he was sent by the Father, that he was the Son of God; and most incredibly, that he and the Father were one. He didn't just say these things, he demonstrated them in the most dramatic and public way he could. For example, to the constant consternation of the Pharisees, he very publicly provoked them by healing on the Sabbath, thereby asserting that he was Lord of the Sabbath, that is, that he was God.

But it was feasts at the Temple that constituted the most dramatic, the most public of his teachings. At the Feast of Tabernacles, for example, Jesus healed many people. Now, Jewish tradition long held that the Messiah would, in fact, appear at this very festival and heal people. In a rite during this same festival, four enormous menorahs were lit at night to illuminate the entire Temple area, not unlike the pillar of fire that the Israelite's followed through the desert. In the light of these menorahs, Jesus proclaimed to the people, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me ... will have the light of life." On the first day of the same feast, water from the pool of Siloam was brought to the Temple with great ceremony. The climax of the feast was a libation offering of this Siloam water poured out before God. Our Lord took this occasion to publicly proclaimed that he was the source of this living water.

During the Feast of the Dedication of the Temple which celebrated the completion and consecration of the Temple in Jerusalem, Jesus proclaimed that he was the Temple not made by human hands that if torn down would be rebuilt in three days! And finally, St. John the Baptist said of Our Lord, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," thereby prophetically anticipating the Paschal Sacrifice of the New Covenant and claiming for Our Lord the most sacred of Jewish feasts.

Next, Our Lord led them as far as Bethany which was a few miles from Jerusalem. The reason he stopped at Bethany was because it was a kind of a way-station, a center for caring for the sick, aiding the destitute, and assisting pilgrims on their way to Jerusalem. Furthermore, Bethany is near Mount Olivet, which, according to the Prophet Zechariah, will be the very place Our Lord returns to at His 2nd coming! By ascending from Bethany, He was telling us that this is where we were to wait for him, among the poor and the lowly, and more than that, that we should become poor and lowly ourselves, for that is who He will come to when he returns! And that is where he must find us when he returns; that is who we must be when he returns!

DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION continued...

Our Lord then gloriously ascended to take his place, as before, at the Father's right hand, from which he will return in the last days. We have received the power Our Lord spoke of, for the Holy Spirit has come upon each one of us. We, then, are His witnesses. We are to bear witness to him in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Celebrating 175 Years of Faith! Did You Know. Fr. William Hinkley, who was pastor of St. Joseph's Church from 1891-1917, during the building of the present church elicited donations of articles for the new church as a perpetual memorial. Fr. Hinkley purchased the three Archangel windows over the alter at \$400 each: The center Archangel Michael, was in memory of his parents, whose seven children entered religious life, five priests and the two girls entered the sisters of Notre Dame; the Archangel Gabriel on the left was dedicated to Rev. Wm. M. Carey who was first to encourage Fr. Hickey to enter the priesthood; And the Archangel Raphael on the right was dedicated to Rev. D. J. Kelly pastor of St. Joseph's from 1857-1867.




