## FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

# PENTECOST

How many images and symbols of the Holy Spirit can you think of today? (Dove, Fire, Wind, Breath...) One of the most unusual images is found in Ancient Ireland, the wild goose! I think the Irish might have something for us to consider today because when you reflect upon the image of the Holy Spirit descending like a beautiful dove you can almost hear the gentle harp strings in the background lulling you into a peaceful relaxed state.

Thinking about the image of a wild goose descending upon you creates a very different picture! A wild goose is one noisy, pesky, bothersome bird, jarring us out of our complacency into action. Doesn't the Holy Spirit at times act that way in our lives? (*Image of Wild Geese from ThisIsChurch.com*)

After all, the Acts of the Apostles recounts that there was quite a commotion when the Spirit arrived on the scene. A noise like a strong driving wind...tongues as of fire, various languages present all speaking about "the mighty acts of God." That's quite a wake-up call!

In our reading from Acts, the people had gathered in Jerusalem because the time for Pentecost was fulfilled. Pentecost was actually a Jewish festival which was a thanksgiving celebration for the wheat harvest. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek word meaning "fifty." The festival was always celebrated in Jerusalem and began fifty days after Passover.

The Jewish celebration of Pentecost remembered God's gift of the covenant with the people at Mt. Sinai. It was at this point when the people of Israel became God's people; they vowed that they would do all that the Lord their God had instructed them, and the covenant was sealed with blood. (Exodus 24). We gather today 50 days after Easter to celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death and the fulfillment of his promise to send the Holy Spirit to be with us.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are given the gifts of wisdom, understanding, knowledge, right judgment, courage, reverence, wonder and awe. Use these gifts often and you will find peace in the midst of any storm, suffering or sadness.

This is what Jesus was teaching his disciples as he appeared to them after the resurrection. His glorified and risen body still showed the marks of crucifixion, but they were no longer bleeding and festering. They had become sacred wounds. It seems to me that this is a reminder to us that there is going to be suffering in life. There are times when life knocks the wind out of us.

- The devastation of a tornado tearing through your neighborhood.
- The discovery of a terminal illness.
- Being let go from your job.
- Loss of trust in a friend.
- The death of a family member.
- The news of another mass shooting in our country.

These experiences can lay us low and cause us to live in fear and doubt. Then, when we least expect it, Jesus breaks into our life and breathes upon us the gift of the Holy Spirit, giving us the gift of peace! When we connect our suffering with the suffering of Jesus, then our suffering is redemptive; it has the power to heal, to be remembered in a new way.

God blessed each of us with gifts that are meant to be used for the life of the Church. When we bring these gifts together amazing things will happen. Let's take our cue from the wild goose, an image of the Holy Spirit that reminds us that we should not be timid or shy in living the message of the gospel and proclaiming the praises of God.

175th Series - Did You Know: The church bell in the Tower of St. Joseph's Church was baptized or blessed as "Patrick", this is the same bell placed in the original church building 1859. The bell was made in Cincinnati and weighs 3600 pounds it was placed in the present tower of the "new" church and was used the first time on Christmas Day 1910. Two small windows in the tower entrance (handicap entrance) depict St. Peter in Chains Cathedral and the original St. Joseph's Church.
