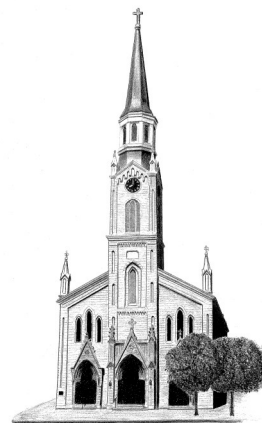

FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Celebrating the Feast of the Precious Blood

"Who am I?" This question comes to mind as I reflect upon the scripture readings for the Solemnity of the Precious Blood. It is a question that takes us into the mystery of God's creative love and our identity as human beings. "Who am I?" Because of the gift of our Baptism we can say, "I am a person redeemed in the Blood of Christ!"

Coming to an awareness of our identity as a people redeemed in the Blood of Christ is critical to our development as children of God. By looking into scripture, we can research our identity within God's family tree from one generation to the next; our ancestors handing on to us what they received from the Lord. This relationship is expressed in the form of a covenant.

In the bible, covenants express what it means to be in relationship with God and one another; it's our way of standing together. So, when Moses approached the people of God with "all the words and ordinances of the Lord" they agreed to do all that the Lord had told them. (Ex. 24) This agreement, this unconditional covenant was sealed with the blood of life offered in sacrifice.

When Jesus gathered his disciples to share the Passover meal, he gave new meaning to this covenant of love by offering the cup of the covenant which would be sealed in His own blood. In the offering of Christ's blood, we do not see a renewal of the covenant of old; what we see is the gift of a new and eternal covenant.

The bold statement that Jesus makes at the last supper, to drink his blood, helps us to realize that we are no longer talking about an ordinary people or an ordinary age. The drinking of blood was something forbidden by Jewish law because blood, the source of life, was sacred to God. But what Jesus is saying is that the blood that belongs to God now belongs to the community of those who believe in Jesus and follow him. The life-force of God is now with the disciples of Jesus in a special way through his Precious Blood which binds us together as one.

That is why St. Paul says, "you are no longer strangers and sojourners" looking for an identity, you are "members of the household of God" with a heritage "built upon the foundation of the Apostles and prophets." (Eph. 2) When we claim our identity as a people redeemed in the Blood of Christ, we are strengthened in the awareness of who we are and the life we share in the Precious Blood.

- Through the Blood of Christ, we are able to draw nearer to God and one another.
- Through the Blood of Christ, we have the power to overcome evil.
- Through the Blood of Christ, we are washed clean of sin.
- Through the Blood of Christ, the price of our salvation has been paid, once and for all.
- Through the Blood of Christ, we share in Christ's victory over death.
- Through the Blood of Christ, we are spiritually alive.
- Through the Blood of Christ, we find peace.

When we lose touch of our identity as a people redeemed in the Blood of Christ, we drift along the journey of life filled with worry, fear, doubt, and selfishness.

To help you maintain an awareness of your identity as a member of God's holy family redeemed in the Blood of Christ, I've included this prayer for your on-going reflection. Allow the words of this prayer to soak deeply into your heart and draw strength from the life and power of the Precious Blood.

Let us pray. "Brothers and sisters in Christ, we are all washed clean in the Blood of the Lamb, our sins forgiven, our hearts strengthened, our lives given purpose. Grant to us this day, O saving God, the power of the Precious Blood so that we might see the violence and disharmony around and within me. Move each of us to bring your life giving love, your reconciling power to those who do not know you and cannot hear your voice in the events of their lives. May this day be one of praise and honor to the saving Blood of Jesus. Now and forever." Amen.

175th Series - Did You Know: In 1847-1848 The original style of the first St. Joseph Church was Grecian with a central steeple. Due to cost the steeple and rear half of the church was not completed initially. The brick church was forty- five feet wide and half the length of the eventual 88 feet, at a cost of \$6,000. The church was completed by Fr. Kelley with the completion of the steeple (1859) with a clock tower and in 1860 adding the back half of the building bringing it to the 88 feet.
