#### **DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION**

That's all you want??!!??

The readings today seem pretty straight-forward and easy to understand, don't they? The Old Testament reading begins with a rather intriguing dialogue between Abraham and God. On the surface, it seems Abraham is bargaining with God, trying to convince God to be merciful; testing God as it were. But if the reading had started just a few verses earlier, we would have learned that, on the contrary, unbeknownst to Abraham, God had turned the tables on him and Abraham was the one being tested! In those verses it said, the Lord chose Abraham to become a great and mighty nation and to, "Keep the way of the Lord by doing what is just and right." And by telling Abraham about Sodom and Gomorrah, God was essentially asking Abraham, "What should I do with the wickedest cities on earth?"

And as we heard, Abraham pleaded with God for mercy for the righteous and the sinners alike. In doing this, Abraham passed God's test with flying colors and showed his heart was one with the Lord; the Lord who repeatedly and persistently begs all to turn from their sins and accept his grace and mercy.

Abraham's conversation with God also tells us something about their relationship. Because of his faith and love – his heart for God, Abraham's relationship with God was simultaneously as intimate as one might have with a spouse; it was utterly reverent as befits a relationship with the divine; and it was quintessentially Jewish in that it exhibited a familiarity and openness one might have with a dear brother or sister.

We see the same desire for that reverent intimacy in the Gospel when the disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. Then Our Lord teaches them that most beautiful and beloved of prayers, the Our Father. He then goes on to teach them something we have already seen in Abraham, persistence in prayer, never giving up. It's almost like God is asking us to test Him in this, isn't it? Just ask, he tells us, and I will give you whatever you ask for.

And hasn't that been your experience with prayer? Anything we ask for in prayer, no matter what it is, we receive, right? We just need to name it and claim it as the TV evangelists say, right? Oh, that hasn't been your experience? There are things you ask for but don't receive? How can this be? Maybe, like with Abraham, God has turned the tables on us. We thought he was telling us to test him, but really, he is testing us.

Maybe God wants us to examine what we ask Him for, what we are seeking, and on which doors we are knocking. Are we, in fact, asking our Father for snakes and scorpions rather than fish and eggs? Are we seeking mere possessions, more stuff for ourselves? Are we knocking at the door of worldly success, fame, or power? If we ask selfishly, if we ask for things God knows will lead us into temptation or for things that are outright bad for us, then we are asking God for snakes and scorpions, and we should not expect our Father in heaven, who alone is good, to give them to us.

But perhaps we have moved beyond this, perhaps we are asking God for fish and eggs, for what we truly need. Jesus himself said God knows you need food, drink, and clothes. We should not hesitate, then, to ask for what we truly need.

But as in the first reading, there is more here in the Gospel than meets the eye. God is turning the tables on us yet again! How? He has so much more to give. "You are not asking me for too much," says the Lord, "you are asking me for too little!" I stand ready to satisfy your deepest longings! If you but ask, I will give to you the kingdom of God and his righteousness. I will give the Holy Spirit to those who ask for him!!!

You see, when we have a heart like his, God is ready to give us anything we ask for and much, much, more. If we seek to grow in

virtue, for instance, if we ask Him for the opportunity to practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, if the door we are knocking on is the way of faith, hope and love; we will find, we will receive, and the door will be opened.

If we want to have a relationship with God like Abraham did in the first reading, like Moses who spoke with God face-to-face as one friend speaks to another, like Our Lady who is closer to Our Lord than anyone else on earth – that relationship is ours for the asking. That, brothers and sisters, is what God made us for!!

What, then, is the deepest desire of our heart? If it is not for a deeper, ever more intimate relationship with Him, then, I would submit to you, that a heart for him is the first thing we should be asking for.

175th Series - Did You Know: The Architectural style of the church is Italian Romanesque, the virtues of this ecclesiastical type are stateliness, simplicity, and detail. The most striking aspect of the "new" church is the location of the tower, set back towards the sanctuary. The architects hired were McGinnis and Walsh of Boston at a 1909 building cost of \$95,700.

**Did You Know:** In 1943 the Irish Archbishop McNicolas transferred the parish into the care of the predominately German Fathers of the Precious Blood and have served the people of the parish since then.

**Did You Know:** The present organ at St. Josephs was installed in June 1927 at a cost of \$3600. The organ was refurbished in 1983.
