Welcome Fr. Seraphine!



This week we welcome Fr. Seraphine Lesiriam, CPPS to the Downtown Dayton Catholic Churches and our new Family of Parishes. Fr. Seraphine will live with Fr. Angelo and Fr. Ken at St. Joseph's rectory and minister within our parishes for the next four years.

Fr. Seraphine is coming to us from the Tanzanian Province of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. He was born on February 14, 1970, in Moshi, Kilimanjaro. His parents are Leonard Lesiriam (Living) and Regina Athanas (Deceased). He has two brothers living in Manyoni, Singida.

Fr. Seraphine entered the seminary of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in 1983 and was ordained July 30, 2002. (Happy 20th Anniversary!) He first served as a parochial vicar at St. Nicholas parish for two years and then became pastor for two years at Precious Blood parish. Then Fr. Seraphine was called upon to become the Administrator of St. Gaspar Referral and Teaching Hospital in Itigi, Signida. His ministry involved such things as Human Resources, oversite of finances and he was spokesperson for the hospital which is sponsored by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Father remained at the hospital for 16 years and then was reassigned as parochial vicar at St. Francis Xavier parish in Dodoma.

Earlier this year, Fr. Seraphine was asked to consider a new assignment with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in the United States Province. He gladly accepted the invitation to begin this new ministry with us and arrived in Dayton last week. Fr. Seraphine enjoys reading all types of books and watching soccer and visiting people. In reflecting on this assignment Father said, "Since this is a new ministry, new culture and new people I need to learn from all of you the way of doing things in this pastoral setting while bringing my gifts and talents and culture to share with you." Welcome, Fr. Seraphine. We are grateful that you have responded generously to God's call in your life.

Fr. Angelo's Reflection

Today, Qoheleth puts us in touch with a very human struggle. Probably a better translation for the word "vanities" we heard in today's reading would be "Illusions." Illusions are answers we give to some of life's basic questions that just are not true. They are like shadows we chase in life.

So often in our lives we chase after things we think will bring us happiness. One example is the illusion which says: "I would be happy if only I had more." This is an illusion that Jesus addresses in today's gospel parable. For the rich man, happiness was to be found in having more. It's not that possessions are bad; it's our attachment to them that gets us into trouble. The illusion he lived with was, "If pile up more and I'll be happy and satisfied." The question becomes, "How do we escape being possessed by our possessions?"

Another illusion or shadow that can haunt us is the desire to be like someone else. "If only I was like so and so...then I'd be happy." Comparing ourselves to someone else is a dead end! Each of us is made in God's image and likeness and so we are a wonderful treasure of God's love with a unique mission to share while on this earth.

It is not easy confronting the illusions we live with each day. It takes courage to see things as they really are in life. So, where do we find direction? St. Paul gives us a clue: "Seek what is above...Think of what is above, not what is on earth. Your life is hidden with Christ in God." Through the gift of baptism, we enter a covenant of love in which

we are drawn into the same intimate relationship of love that Jesus shares with the Father. It is a relationship that carries both the cross of suffering as well as the promise of glory!

Rather than finding comfort in shopping for more stuff or drinking more or spending more hours on the internet or running after things that you think will bring you happiness, build for yourself treasures in heaven through acts of charity, mercy, respect, and love. St. Teresa of Calcutta used to say that if she had not picked up that first person dying on the streets of Calcutta, she would not have picked up the thousands of others later in life. Charity begins one person at a time. When we become rich in what matters to God" then peace will rest in our hearts. This week follow Mother Teresa's prayer when she said, "Let every action of mine be something beautiful for God." That's what it means to store up treasure in heaven.


