FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Fr. John Kavanaugh tells the story of a time when he spent a month working at the House of the Dying in Calcutta, trying to find clarity about his future. "On the first morning, I met Mother Teresa after Mass at dawn. She asked, "And what can I do for you?" I asked her to pray for me. "What do you want me to pray for?" I voiced the request I had borne thousands of miles: "Pray that I have clarity." She said "No." That was that. When I asked why, she answered that clarity was the last thing I was clinging to and had to let go of. When I commented that she herself had always seemed to have the clarity I longed for, she laughed: "I never have had clarity; what I've always had is trust. So, I will pray that you have trust in God."

So often we want clarity, but all God asks of us is trust. Our readings this weekend help us to see that trust is strengthened by reflecting upon our faith tradition and the reality of God's steadfast love from one generation to the next. By reflecting upon the night of Passover, we see that God's chosen people trusted in faith that God would protect them and free them from oppression. There was a sense of vigilance as they prepared for their journey. For forty years in the desert, God molded and shaped their hearts as His chosen people guiding and protecting them to the Promise Land. There story is our story.

Digging deeper into our faith tradition, we can draw strength from the life of Abraham, our Father in faith. Abraham and Sara obeyed God's call to leave behind all that was familiar to them. God promised that they would have descendants are numerous as the stars in the sky. Trusting in faith meant a willingness to sacrifice their son Isaac, placing their future fully in God's hands.

In Luke's gospel we hear words of reassurance, "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom." Belonging to God's flock means that our value comes from our identity as children of God, it is not found in material treasures or other people's opinions or the job we do. God has made a tremendous investment in us. Through the Precious Blood of Jesus our lives have been purchased and our sin washed away. Just as God has treated us with such dignity and respect, we too are called to honor the dignity found in each person created in God's image and likeness.

In this journey of faith there are times when we will be led into the desert for purification. This may mean the loss of all that is dear to us. Sometimes it means taking up the cross of illness or standing up for what is right. No matter what desert we enter, we must walk by faith and never give up. Remember, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for, and evidence of things not seen." (Heb. 11:1)

Over the last several weeks we have been following Jesus as he journeyed to Jerusalem. Along the way he has been instructing the disciples, telling them that they are being sent like lambs among wolves. Like the Good Samaritan, we are to have hearts of mercy for those in need. In the exchange between Martha and Mary, we learned the importance of being present to Jesus. Praying as Jesus taught us means trusting in God to provide for our daily bread. In turn, God is counting on us to be people of charity, storing up treasures in heaven. Finally, as we journey in faith, we must be vigilant for the master's return by not growing lazy, complacent, or cynical.

Jesus is counting on us to walk with one another as we make our way from being lost to having purpose, from guilt to forgiveness, from grief to consolation, from loneliness to belonging, from anger to peace, from sickness to health, from despair to hope. In the end, all we will take with us from this life is the love we have for God and the relationships we have formed with one another while on earth. Our call is not to have greater clarity, but greater trust. By bringing others to Christ, and building a community of faith, we will be found ready to meet the Lord when He comes in glory.


