FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

When I was traveling a lot as Provincial Director of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, I used to pass the time in airports watching people. When there was a delay or an issue with a flight you could see some people's true colors come to the surface as they approached the gate counter believing they are entitled to preferential treatment. "I'm a Gold Medallion frequent flier you've got to get me out of here." Another says, "I want to talk to your supervisor; maybe they can handle this mess as you clearly aren't competent to do."

Jesus enjoyed watching people too. In today's gospel he could see the various guests vying for the best seats in the house. The cultural practice of his time consisted of an elaborate system of seat assignments at table. Those of a lower social rank were in different rooms and served different food than those in the main dining room. How close you were to the host spoke of your social status and provided opportunities for networking with others.

Leave it to Jesus not only to observe the self-seeking behavior of the guests, he also pointed out the self-seeking practices of the host who only invited people who could repay him in the future. How could this be seen as a gift or an act of charity? The Pharisee hosting the dinner decided who was worthy or not worthy to sit near him at table.

Those who will gather at the heavenly banquet table will not be there because of social status or popularity. We are all children of the same Father. Those who gather at the heavenly banquet table will include people we least expect...the poor, the lame, and the blind, all those marginalized of the world. These are the people Jesus reached out to and directed his mission toward as he announced the Good News of God's love and mercy.

So, what does Jesus see when he watches our dinner parties or social gatherings? Are we concerned with puffing ourselves up, looking for positions of honor or entitlement? Do we only invite a select few to our table, treating some better than others? A clear message in today's scripture readings can be summarized in one word "humility." Instead of racing to be first, cutting others off in traffic, pushing to get what you want; why not stop and serve the needs of others? Think about who gathers at your table and who is missing from the table conversation because an important voice in the pursuit of truth may not be there.

Humility means putting someone else's needs ahead of our own. St. Thomas Aquinas put it this way, "If God has so humbled himself for our sake, should not we submit to one another for God's sake?" Sirach reminds us that the blessing of living the virtue of humility is the gift of peace. St. Teresa of Calcutta understood humility in this way when she said, "We all have a duty to work for peace, but in order to achieve peace, we should learn from Jesus to be meek and humble of heart."

Embracing a life of humility means we must accept who we are and whose we are. Humility is not putting ourselves down or denying our true worth. We are God's children, and we belong to God. A humble person recognized that all that I have and all that I am is a gift from God and not my own doing. Fr. Stuhlmeuller, a scripture scholar noted, "Once we forget that gifts are gifts, not personal property; once we no longer remember that gifts are given and not earned by our abilities or merits, at that very moment we have lost the gift. It is no longer a gift, but something stolen from God, and we return to our sinful state. Unless we rid ourselves of pride and favoritism, we will not possess God's gift of faith, peace or blessed hope."

Each of us is born into this life with clenched fists. The path of humility seeks to open our hands and hearts, to see all things as gift so that God can place into our life or take from our life whatever God deems appropriate. If you are looking for peace in your life, follow the path of humility.

175th Series - Did You Know: On September 5, 1909, Archbishop Moeller laid the cornerstone at the far side of the bell tower for the new church.

Did You Know: In October 1972 as part of the 125th anniversary of St. Joseph Church the Italian organizations of Dayton, led by Joe and Fran Franchina, promoted Festa San Giuseppe in the style of the old country. The celebration started with a solemn procession with statues, that started a block from the church and had the participation of political and Catholic religious leaders of the community. A sermon from Archbishop Elko ended in Italian, to the delight of the older generation. After Mass a celebration in school cafeteria that was decorated as an Italian village and Italian food abounded throughout the day.
