Fr. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Imagine this, a simple idea to plan a birthday party for Grandma grows into a wonderful family reunion with people coming in from all over the county. A spark in the heart of a few elderly Sisters of the Precious Blood seeking to do something about the violence in the city of Dayton which grows into an ecumenical coalition of people praying at the site of homicides in Dayton.

Consider the simple seed of love for a family member who has cancer which inspires them to organize a "Relay for Life" in which thousands of people walk for the cure. Or the person-to-person Life Chain event going on this Sunday at abortion clinics which was started by a small California-based pro-life group called "Please Let Me Live." This movement has grown to one of the largest Pro-life projects in the United States. With faith, the tiniest of seeds, the tiniest of ideas and inspirations can grow to touch many more lives than we ever thought possible, building a culture of life. With faith in God, we can do amazing things.

When we talk about the gift of faith we're not talking so much about doctrine or dogma, we are talking more about a relationship in which a person responds to God's invitation to share in His love. We have been created in God's image and likeness and the source of our dignity and identity and worth is not found in what we do or what we have, but in who we are as beloved of God. This awareness shapes how we live our lives. Our faith increases as we learn to trust in God and follow God's Will in our lives.

The story of salvation history shows us that God has remained faithful to his Word from one generation to the next. Our role in God's covenant of love is to obediently cooperate in God's plan of salvation. That is why it is important for us to remember that we are servants of the Lord. We are to serve the Lord and not our own self-interests and desires. This call to service is a life-long journey that is never finished this side of heaven.

A quick look at the news today shows that as servants of the Lord we have a lot of work to do. Though written around 2660 years ago, Habakkuk describes a general disrespect for life, that could be used to describe our own day...violence, destruction, strife and discord, hatred and suffering are all around us and we want to cry out like Habakkuk, "Lord, are you unaware of what is happening? The Lord responds by telling Habakkuk to write a message so that it will be clearly understood and remembered. The message is simple, "Have Faith!" God who created the heavens and the earth is with us, he will never abandon us. We see this promise most clearly fulfilled in God's covenant of love sealed in the Precious Blood of Jesus. Christ has conquered sin and death forever. Our job is to keep pushing forward building a culture of life, especially when the going gets tough, because the vision has its time.

Today's gospel suggests that our responsibility is to simply do what we are obligated to do. This is what the word "unprofitable" in the last line of the gospel means. As people of faith, we put the gospel into action not so we can be rewarded; we do it because that is what is expected of us as servants of the Lord. By opening our hearts to God's love and mercy, we let Christ dwell in us, and we see more clearly the unique beauty of each person, and their dignity as a child of God.

What we come to see is that being faithful in this life is already living what heaven will be. This is why St. Catherine of Siena would say: "Every step of the way to heaven is heaven." The more we can live in faith, follow God's plan and trust in God's love, the more we are able to reflect to others the life that awaits us in heaven. Never underestimate the tiny idea or the unexpected inspiration that comes to you from the Lord. Have faith, be a servant of the Lord, act on that inspiration and you'll be amazed at what God will accomplish!
