Fr. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

Several years ago, a friend of mind was doing a dialogue homily with a group of young children using today's Gospel reading about the 10 lepers. He asked them, "What was wrong with the 9 that didn't come back?" One young student quickly raised his hand and shouted out, "Because they had amnesia!" Not a bad answer. Often, we get amnesia and take for granted the many blessings we receive each day, simple things like our home, clothing, electricity, cars, education, or health care. For many people in our world these are all beyond their reach. Do we thank God for these blessings?

Strangely enough our ability to reason and to act creatively can become a stumbling block by which we forget about God or become strangers to God. So often we want to control life, have things our way, which in the end, blinds us to the hand of God at work in our life.

Look at Naaman, we only hear the end of the story in today's first reading. Naaman was a Syrian General who was proud and strong, yet in danger of losing everything because he had contracted Leprosy. Naaman was looking for a flashy cure where the Prophet Elisha would come out of his house and move his hand over the leprosy and be cured. Instead, Elisha told him to wash seven times in the Jordan River. Naaman almost turned down the chance to be cured because his pride got in the way, and he refused to go down into the Jordan River. God works through one of his servants who said, "What do you have to lose?" Naaman over comes his pride and enters the river and is cured. He wants to give a gift to Elisha, but Elisha refuses. It is God who has brought healing. God is the one to thank.

In today's gospel I can imagine that all the lepers who were cured had gratitude in their hearts for the healing gift they had received but they did not translate that feeling into thanksgiving. Today's gospel shows very well the difference between gratitude and thanksgiving. Gratitude is a feeling of appreciation that we experience in our hearts. Thanksgiving is the act of putting that feeling of gratitude into action by giving thanks to the giver. It is not enough to feel gratitude--we must also take time to acknowledge the giver of the gift.

Like the leper who returned to Jesus to give thanks, we have come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God who saves us. When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, a word that means thanksgiving, we give thanks to God for the gift of His creative love at work in our lives. Thomas Merton once said: "To be grateful is to recognize the love of God in everything He has given us, and He has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of His love, every moment of existence is a grace, for it brings with it immense graces from Him."

This truth motivates us to follow the example of Jesus, to respond to the crying needs of those less fortunate than us. In doing so we are God's blessings to others, and we are blessing God. Thanksgiving requires trust in God. How can we give thanks if we do not believe that whatever comes our way, God will be with us? When we worry, we deplete our sense of gratitude. The way to worry less is to give thanks more. As someone once said, "When life gives you 100 reasons to cry, show life that you have 1000 reasons to smile." "Faith is not about everything turning out OK; faith is about being OK no matter how things turn out, because you know you are a beloved of God." That's the faith St. Paul expresses as he is suffering in prison; in the midst of his pain, he rejoices in the Lord, offering his suffering for the sake of those who will come after him.

Today, we are thankful that Jesus accompanies us on our journey through life, healing us and leading us to salvation and glory. As 14th century theologian Meister Eckhart reminds us, "If the only prayer you say is Thank You that would be enough."

May we give witness to others of our constant gratitude to God for all the blessings we have received.


