FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

I have no doubt that all of us here today have turned to God in prayer at one time or another. Suppose one day you started to pray and got God's voicemail instead with the recording, "Thank you for calling My Father's House." Please select one of the following options: press 1 for a request, press 2 to complain, press 3 to give thanks, for all other inquiries press 4." So, you press 1 and you hear, "We're sorry, all of the angels are busy helping other believers right now."

Today's readings offer us an opportunity to reflect upon prayer and in particular, the need to be persistent in prayer. In the first reading, Moses is at prayer using an ancient prayer posture. With staff in hand, his hands are raised to the Lord, drawing strength from God. But Moses could not keep his hands up all day and so Aaron and Hur assisted him by supporting his hands.

Our gospel reading carries a similar message. Jesus teaches the disciples the importance of praying without becoming weary by telling a parable about the persistent widow who comes before an unjust judge. In the time of Jesus, a widow had no voice, no legal rights. She was at the mercy of the nearest male relative and no one has stepped forward to help her.

Rather than being helpless and defenseless, the widow finds her voice and boldly faces the unjust judge. Eventually, the hardened heart of the judge begins to soften. In the English translation the judge says, "I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me." Scripture scholars tell us that in the Greek text, the verb actually refers to a boxing term that literally means "to strike under the eye." The ruthless, insensitive judge is now fearful that the widow will give him and his reputation a black eye. Her rights were clearly being ignored and so to protect himself, he grants her request for justice.

Though we may feel weak and defenseless in relation to the challenges of life, we have been given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us live our faith with courage and persistence. God never gives up on us and we must never give up on God. In the verses just before today's reading, Jesus has given his disciples a very frightening description of the end times and how the disciples can expect to experience suffering, trials and distress. Despite this the believer must not lose hope and needs to continue to stay connected to God through prayer.

As Jesus embraced the cross, He seemed helpless in the face of the executioners, yet he won for us the price of our salvation by defeating the powers of sin and death. His prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane enabled Him to remain strong in the face of terrible suffering, rejection, and disappointment. His prayer strengthened him and an angel from heaven appeared to help him like Aaron and Hur helping Moses.

Our prayer during periods of darkness is not meant to wear down God by pestering Him, our prayer opens our hearts to receive God's grace and helps us to see that the answer we seek will come in God's time, not ours. We instinctively lock the doors of our heart when problems and challenges come our way. It is by our prayer that the Holy Spirit chips away at the door of our heart so that we will be open to God's will.

When we are most challenged God puts people into our lives to help us to be persistent in our prayer and in living our faith. That is why it is important for us to gather here in church to support one another, to hold each other up when our prayer life starts to weaken and fade. We need each other to hear more clearly God's plan for our lives.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we have all we need to be faithful. As St. Paul reminds us, "Proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." Are you filled with worry and anxiety, then pray. Have you stopped praying about a need in your life or are you ready to give up? Do not quit. Be persistent, keep on praying, and be sure to lean on others for support.
