#### FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

In these final weeks of the church year the scripture readings draw our attention to end-times and the promise of eternal life. In our First Reading from the Book of Maccabees we see that a mother and her seven sons held firm to their beliefs and were put to death for refusing to violate God's law. Just as they had the freedom to choose life or death, we too prepare for death by the way we live each day.

The prospects of the final judgment need not frighten us, but rather, can encourage us to see each day as a new opportunity to prepare ourselves for eternal life. Over and over again, Jesus reminds us that living the gospel is more than simply following religious practices of the law. To live the gospel is to continually live the dying and rising of Jesus Christ in our day-to-day experiences.

In our gospel reading the Sadducees were trying to mock Jesus with an elaborate story of seven brothers experiencing death after marrying the same woman. The Sadducees denied the resurrection and so they were trying to trap Jesus in his speech. The Sadducees were what we might call "fundamentalist." They only followed the first five books of the bible, and it was their interpretation that the teaching on resurrection life was not present in those books.

Jesus challenges the Sadducees by referring to the story of Moses in the Book of Exodus. Moses hears the Lord through the burning bush say, "I AM the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob," not I WAS the God of your fathers. Jesus challenges them to see that "God is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

As the Sadducees found out, trying to make a comparison between life on earth and life in heaven is not always a helpful proposition. Life in heaven will not be bound by the experiences, practices, and traditions of life on earth. Jesus corrects the Sadducees in their misinterpretation of marriage by teaching that the institution of marriage will not be seen in the same way in heaven. Why? Because in heaven we will be in a perfect relationship of love with God and all people.

When we are born into everlasting life, our lives will no longer need to be modeled after Christ because we will be fully living with and in Christ. Marriage as a sacrament modeling Christ's love for the Church will be fulfilled in heaven. In the banquet feast of heaven, we will not need to have models or symbols of what life "will be" because we will live in the fullness of God's love. The relationships of love that we form on earth are perfected in heaven.

This is one of the reasons why the church honors the celibate life of a Priest, Religious Sister or Brother. The witness of our life points to the life that will be found in the resurrection, where the fullness of life and love will be experienced in the presence of the living God. In the meantime, the Lord is counting on each of us to live our vocation, our baptismal calling to the best of our ability. Our call is NOT to simply live life; we are called to embrace the love that makes life possible.

Instead of being fearful or worrying about the challenges that face us, as people of faith, we welcome the challenge as an opportunity to give witness to our faith. We know that Jesus is victorious over sin and death. That battle has been won. Remember, in the end God always wins!

What resurrection life will be like is a mystery. Trying to understand this is like a child in their mother's womb trying to understand what life will be like outside the womb. How can the child comprehend what it will be like to live in this new world? And so, we walk by faith as best we can in this world as we await our birth into everlasting life. Just as we have discovered that there is life outside the womb, we can trust that there is life after death; a life beyond anything we could ever imagine, a gift we want to be ready to receive.
