DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

"Do not be afraid to take Mary into your home!"

The Old Testament reading and the Gospel set two men before us today: a king and a carpenter, King Ahaz and St. Joseph. Both had reason to fear what faced them; one gave himself over to his fears, one relied on his faith.

In the eyes of the world, Ahaz was important, wise, and powerful. King Ahaz, though, was quite unlike David his forefather. Ahaz was pretentious, proud, and pathetic. He trusted in himself, his wealth, and the military might of his ally, Assyria. Worse, his piety was a mere showpiece for public consumption – a façade so he might appear respectable in the eyes of the people.

But Ahaz had a real problem. Enemies were massing on Judah's border, ready to attack. So Ahaz had a momentous decision to make; forge an alliance with the treacherous Assyrians or rely on God's promise. God sent Isaiah the prophet to encourage Ahaz to have faith in God, not in foreign armies. But Ahaz had long ago gone beyond merely tempting God. Indeed, he had been taunting God most of his life. Ahaz had sacrificed his own son to false gods and blasphemed God by setting up altars to these false gods in the Temple itself. But God kept faith with Judah even though the King of Judah had abandoned Him. A virgin would conceive and bear a son named Emmanuel, God with us.

To the world, St. Joseph was just a carpenter: ordinary, insignificant, and of no account. But in the eyes of God, Joseph was a man like King David his forefather; a man after God's own heart: just, righteous, and faithful. Like Ahaz, he too was facing a momentous decision: whether to take Mary into his home. And he knew two things with certainty. First, that Mary was a holy and righteous woman and second, she was inexplicably with child.

But when St. Joseph faced his momentous choice, being just, righteous, and faithful, he did not choose the way of fear, but the way of faith. We see this most clearly in how St. Joseph responded to God. In every instance Joseph responded with an unequivocal 'yes' followed by immediate action: (1) Joseph, "did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home."; (2) "Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt."; and (3) Joseph "rose, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel."

Virtually everything St. Joseph did in Holy Scripture had eternal significance, but not a single word of his is written down. I think it is because God wanted to give us a shining example of what humble, silent, faith and sanctity in action looked like. An example of faith and sanctity without the distraction of words. St. Joseph heard God and he obeyed. Period, full stop. The example of Joseph's virtue, strength, holiness, and zeal for God and his immediate obedience does not admit of any evasion or equivocation on our part. This is the hallmark of St. Joseph's spirituality and why among his titles we find: Joseph Most Just, Joseph Most Obedient, Joseph Most Courageous, the Protector of the Church, and the Terror of Demons.

The guardian of Our Lord and Our Lady is not a saint we should imitate, he is a saint we must imitate. And the first thing we must do, like St. Joseph, is not be afraid of Mary our mother and Jesus her divine Son and Our Lord. We must not be afraid of what their example of holiness and sanctity call us to; we must not be afraid of love. In our hearts, Our Lord and Our Lady must find a home.
