

FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION



Requiem Mass for Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI – On Tuesday Evening, January 10th, at 7:00 PM a special Mass for the repose of the soul of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI will be offered at Emmanuel Church for our downtown Dayton parishes. Following the Mass, prayers for the Miraculous Medal Novena will be offered. All are welcome!

Remembering Pope Emeritus Benedict - Joseph Ratzinger was born on April 16, 1927 coming from a traditional family of farmers from Lower Bavaria. His faith and family upbringing prepared him for the harsh experience of the problems connected with the Nazi regime.

After studying philosophy and theology, together with his brother Georg, he was ordained a priest on June 29, 1951 in the Cathedral at Freising. Fr Ratzinger obtained a doctorate in theology and went on to teach dogma and fundamental theology. From 1962 to 1965 he was present during all four sessions of the Second Vatican Council as a chief theological advisor to the Archbishop of Cologne.

In 1977, Pope Paul VI appointed him Archbishop of Munich and Freising and was soon made a Cardinal of the Church. In 1981 he was appointed by Pope John Paul II as Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. His role as President of the Commission for Drafting the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the six years of intense work (1986-92) behind its preparation are one of his many outstanding achievements. As Dean of the College of Cardinals he presided over the College's deliberations during the Vacancy of the Holy See following the death of Pope John Paul II.

On April 19, 2005 Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was elected the 265th Pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church, selecting the name Benedict XVI. Reflecting upon his life, Bishop Barron notes, "At a time when many of the representatives of the secular culture were questioning our capacity to know anything as true, Ratzinger resisted what he termed "the dictatorship of relativism." He claimed, in line with the great Catholic tradition, that certain truths—moral, intellectual, and aesthetic can be known and that this knowledge in fact serves to unite people across religious and cultural divides."

On February 28, 2013, Pope Benedict announced his resignation, becoming the first pope in almost 600 years to resign from the papacy. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI passed away on December 31, 2022 at the age of 95. May he rest in peace.

Celebrating Epiphany!

In today's gospel, the Magi follow a star that caught their attention at its rising and their commitment to follow that star led them to Jesus, the true Light of the world. Even though they were foreign gentiles, God was calling the Magi to begin a journey of conversion. As gentiles they were not familiar with the Jewish scripture or traditions and so it must have come as a surprise to them that the Jewish leaders were not excited about the news of the birth of the new-born King. What's even more striking is that after giving them the location of his birth, the Jewish leaders showed no interest in joining the search.

This raises a point. Did you notice that it seems the star that guided the Magi went away while they were in Jerusalem? Today's passage says that after the Magi met with King Herod, the chief priests and scribes, "Behold, the star that they had seen at its rising now preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star." Why would they have been overjoyed at seeing the star if it was with them all the time? They must have lost the star while in Jerusalem.

Symbolically this says that those who should have been open to the Light of Christ were closed to God and lived in the darkness of their own personal convictions. Maybe the religious leaders had sided with Herod and his brutal, selfish acts and could no longer hear God's voice

or see God's signs. Ask yourself, "Are there times when I am a believer in name only, when my actions and behavior do not reflect what I have learned from God?"

As we begin this New Year be aware of the stars in your life that God is using to lead you to Jesus, the true Light of the world. We are blessed to encounter Jesus Christ in the gift of His Body and Blood that we share today. Don't look down, Look up! and see the glory of the Lord. Let His light shine through you so that you can be like the wise ones the Prophet Daniel spoke of when he said, "Those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever."

Christmas notes from the loft: On the feast of the Epiphany after Communion, Deacon Baldwin will chant an announcement of the moveable feasts of the coming year. This ancient practice "dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date...Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year." (USCCB)
