#### FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

At every Mass, just before we receive Holy Communion, we hear the proclamation, "Behold, the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world." These are the words announced by John the Baptist as he saw Jesus coming toward him. Why would he use the term "Lamb of God?"

The symbol of the Lamb of God contains a memory that is rich and deep within the Jewish people. As a symbol, you could liken it to the honor and respect that we give to the American Flag. According to the official U.S. Flag Code, "the flag represents a living country and is itself a living thing." It's not merely a piece of cloth but something that embodies a nation and its ideals of independence, liberty, hope and unity of purpose. The flag also stands for the sacrifices that have been made for those ideals.

When the Jewish people heard the title "Lamb of God" their minds were immediately drawn to God's saving action at the time of the Exodus when God instructed his people to sacrifice an innocent lamb and to sprinkle its blood on the door post and lintel of the house for protection from the destroyer. This Passover sacrifice began the journey of forming the people of God. The lamb was not some dumb beast, but a symbol of God's power and strength at work in the lives of His people.

With the building of the Temple in Jerusalem, every morning and evening, a lamb was sacrificed for the sins of the people (Ex 29:38-42). Aware of this action, the prophets like Jeremiah and Isaiah both spoke of One who would be brought "like a lamb led to the slaughter" and whose suffering and sacrifice would redeem the people of Israel. Having seen the Holy Spirit come upon Jesus after he was baptized, John the Evangelist puts these words into the mouth of John the Baptist for a purpose, to point out right from the start the identity and purpose of Jesus.

When we use the words, "Lamb of God" during the Mass we are making an important profession of our faith: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away "the sins of the world." John the Baptist is telling us, and we are saying that there is no other means by which we are saved from our sins and that we are called to place all our hope and trust in him. Because of the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are able to recognize Jesus among us and walk in his ways.

And so, we are not simply to admire Jesus, we are asked to imitate him, to do in our lives what Jesus did; to allow our hearts to act like filters that hold the dirt and mess of life and gives back only pure water. Like Jesus we are to absorb the hurt and sin of the world and give back pure love. As someone once said, "Jesus took away the sins of the world by taking hatred and giving back love; by taking in anger and giving out graciousness, by taking in envy and giving back blessing, by taking in bitterness and giving out warmth, by taking in pettiness and given back compassion, by taking in chaos and giving back peace, and by taking in sin and giving back forgiveness."

In today's readings--Isaiah, St. Paul and John the Baptist recognize that the whole world is in need of salvation. That is why it is important that each of us take the time to cultivate a personal relationship with Jesus and to strive to appreciate the depth of His love, mercy, compassion, truth, creativity, and joy! To make our profession of faith in Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Jesus who has redeemed us by his precious blood and offers us life beyond our imagination. If I do not continually seek to grow in my understanding of Jesus, then I am limiting the reach of God's salvation in my life and in the life of so many other people.

We have been created for this specific time and place in history and have been entrusted with the saving mission of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. When we cooperate with God's plan of salvation then amazing things will happen!
