The Revival is a grassroots movement of Catholics, each responding to the gift of the Eucharist in their own way. The U.S. Bishops desire for all Catholics to learn more about the reality of Jesus in the Eucharist and fall more deeply in love with him.

Why Now? Because the Church needs healing and the world needs the Church.

Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal. YEAR OF DIOCESAN REVIVAL June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023

- This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to respond to the Lord's personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through eucharistic congresses and events.

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS July 17 – 21, 2024

Indianapolis, Indiana, Lucas Oil Stadium

At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis to reconsecrate their hearts to the source and summit of our faith.



The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) has been presented with a relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis of Italy. **Blessed Carlo Acutis** was an Italian teenager who used technology to spread devotion to the Eucharist before his death at age fifteen from leukemia in 2006. He offered his sufferings for the Church and for the Holy Father, and Pope Francis has called him a role model for young people. He was beatified in 2020 and is one of the intercessors for the national Eucharistic Revival, a multi-year initiative by the bishops of the United States to

reinvigorate devotion in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Cardinal Dolan received the relic on behalf of the USCCB who will be the guardian of the relic for the multi-year Revival initiative. Opportunities for the faithful throughout the United States to venerate Blessed Carlo's relic as a part of the Revival will be made available.
