### FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

A teacher once asked a young student to define salt. The student hesitated a bit and then said, "Salt is the stuff that makes french fries taste so good!" The scripture readings chosen for us today invite us to look at two important symbols of discipleship—salt and light.

Salt is used to preserve, to purify and to bring out flavor. As a preservative, salt keeps food from rotting. In the same way, Christians are to preserve and purify the culture in which they live from moral decay by fighting sin and evil, standing up for the Truth that is given to us by God through prayer, fasting and the very witness of our lives. As salt brings out flavor in food we are to give flavor to life by bringing out the best in others and using the gifts and talents that God has given us to make the world a better place.

The mission that Jesus has given to us is not a call to simply get used to the darkness of sin in the world and tough it out until he comes in glory. No, we are to be the Light of Christ in the world today. As a child, I remember having a glow-in-the-dark statue of St. Joseph, you know, the plastic material that soaks in the light and then allows that light to glow in the dark. You could say that Jesus wants us to be glow-in-the-dark Christians! Through the gift of baptism, we recognize that God did not simply give us life, we are given a share in God's divine life. By allowing the Light of Christ to shine through us we bring meaning and purpose to life in imitation of Jesus and provide a path of hope for others.

The prophet Isaiah says that when we share bread with the hungry and clothe the naked and shelter the oppressed we are a light shining in darkness, a symbol of the dawning day of the Lord. Jesus echoes these words in his teachings and says to us, "You are the light of the world" when you care for the widow and orphan, the immigrant and refugee, the lost and forsaken, the unborn and the elderly, the sick and the poor.

The Light of Christ that we are given to share helps us navigate our way in the journey of life. For example, if you boarded up all the windows in your home and turned off all the lights you would be in total darkness. Think about how difficult it would be to make your way from room to room in total darkness. When we turn on the lights our journey through the house becomes very easy. We can navigate our way around any obstacle, and we can appreciate the beauty of the home. The light didn't change anything in the space but it did affect how we interacted with the space. This is what the Light of Faith is all about. Without the light of faith our lives are dark and confusing and often dangerous. We easily fall into temptations and loose our way. With the light of faith, we can appreciate the blessings and the crosses that come our way and make connections that give meaning and purpose to life.

The light of faith does not remove the fact that there are obstacles in life such as sin, selfishness, suffering, sickness and storms that challenge us. But with the light of Christ, we know that we never walk alone, and we'll have the wisdom we need to respond appropriately to the challenges as well as the blessings that come our way in life. The journey of faith is not just about personal holiness. We must also be salt and light in the world, touching the lives of those around us with the Light and Life of Christ.

Notes From the Loft: "The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy; therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical sevices" (Sacrosanctum Concilium 116). Why is this so? One reason is that Gregorian chant has always been used exclusively for liturgy; indeed, its roots lie in the ancient Jewish tradition. Another very compelling reason is that chant respects the sung text; rather than stretching or compressing the words to fit the music, the music serves the words. This is most fitting, since what we chant is Sacred Scripture-- the word of God.
