DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

John Milton, the brilliant 17th century poet based his epic poem, *Paradise Lost*, on the episode we read today from Genesis. In that work, when Milton's Satan first beheld Adam and Eve before the fall, he was, despite being filled with hatred and envy, amazed at how "closely they resembled God," and he was, despite himself, in awe of the nobility, beauty, and innocence God had given them. Such was the image and likeness they were created in. In what St. John Paul II called their original nakedness, they were naked and NOT ashamed.

The original nakedness of Adam and Eve meant much more than not wearing clothes; it meant there were no barriers to the communion they (and we) were made for, it meant we could see the world as God did, we could gaze into each other's souls without any fear of being used or exploited. Our bodies were not just the servants of our spirit but full and equal partners, if you will. Our bodies enable the goodness in our spirit to have visible expression.

After the fall, the shame Adam and Eve felt was not that they were naked, per se. They were ashamed of what their nakedness revealed about the inner state of their soul, namely, the loss of communion with God and each other. Now, their body and spirit were at war, each trying to dominate the other.

But Our Lord, in his victory over Satan in the desert regained for us the opportunity, not to restore the Paradise Adam and Eve lost – his victory gained us infinitely more than that. In His victory, He offers us the gift of eternal beatitude with the Most Holy Trinity. He invites us to be partakers/sharers in the very divinity of God.

It is tragically ironic that this was the very thing Satan tempted Adam and Eve with: "You will be like gods," the serpent said! God wanted this for us all along, but not through grasping, disobedience, and rebellion, but through communion with Him; as a gift received, not as wages earned or spoils taken!

The 2nd reading contained an oblique reference to the New Adam who would resist and defeat the temptation of Satan that the Adam and Eve of Genesis succumbed to. In his temptation, Our Lord also shows himself to be this New Adam for in all the ways Adam failed, he triumphed. And he did this first and foremost by showing up to the fight! Adam was by Eve's side throughout the entirety of the temptation but did not say a word. Our Lord, the New Adam, did what the Old Adam wouldn't, he resisted Satan to his face and conquered in the very same areas Adam and Eve were defeated.

Adam and Eve succumbed to the lust of the flesh. Satan tempted Our Lord in the same way to which Our Lord countered: "One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." This is why we fast during Lent, to tame the inordinate desires of the flesh for food and pleasure. Adam and Eve succumbed the lust of the eye, with possessing knowledge that was not theirs to have. Satan tempted Our Lord in the same way, but Our Lord countered: "The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve." This is why we give alms during Lent, to counter the lust of the eye, to tame the desire for possessions and power. Finally, Adam and Eve succumbed to pride, "You will be like gods!" Jesus rejected this crossless glory and said, "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." This is why we are called to special times of prayer during Lent, to counter our pride and to humbly acknowledge our total dependence on He who is God.

Victory over sin – as vital as that is, is not Our Lord's ultimate vision for us – his victory, his sacrifice gained for us infinitely more than that. He offers us the gift of eternal beatitude with the Most Holy Trinity. He invites us to return to the nobility, beauty, and innocence God gave us in the beginning. More than that, He invites us to be partakers in the very divinity of God himself!


