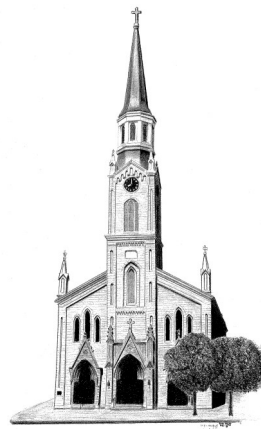

FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION



Today's celebration "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord" holds together two extremes, Jesus who is acclaimed King and Jesus who is the paschal lamb of God who gave his life for the salvation of the world. Many Catholic homes honor this mystery by placing blessed palm branches behind a crucifix as a constant reminder to keep Christ as King of this household and the call to follow Jesus by laying down our life out of love for one another.

As King of heaven and earth, Jesus has come in humility, simplicity and vulnerability. Recall the words of St. Paul, "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave... he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death." The gift of Holy Week teaches us that there is strength in humility, simplicity, and vulnerability.

Scripture scholars tell us that the kind of power Jesus expressed is found in the Greek word *exousia*. Unfortunately, there is no word like this in English. To help us understand the beauty of this word, I like an image that Fr. Ronald Rolheiser uses to describe the power of *exousia*.

"If you would put the strongest man in the world into a room with a newborn baby, which of these two would be more powerful?" At one level the man is more powerful with muscle strength and could destroy the baby. But the baby possesses a different kind of power; a power that will melt the human heart and have the strongest adult cooing and codling the infant as a precious gift. God came to us as a tiny child, with power that is expressed in simplicity by a humble and vulnerable way of life.

In today's Gospel, we heard how Jesus died on the cross to reveal God's power in the world. The power he reveals is not muscle power or physical force. No, Jesus broke the cycle of violence. The power he reveals is rooted in love, a power that inspires us to bend a knee before the cross of Christ. The power of the cross moves our hearts to a deeper faith and trust in God. The cross teaches us that when you are weak you are strong because when we embrace the cross, we are not relying on our strength, but on God's power at work within us.

During this holiest of weeks, we are given a wonderful opportunity to reflect upon God's love revealed to us as *exousia*. Make a special effort this week to follow the example of Jesus and be the face of love by sacrificing yourself through a way of life that is humble, by not thinking of yourself first. Be vulnerable by letting go of control and live in simplicity by getting rid of distractions in your life so that you can keep God at the center of your life.

What is the Triduum? The word comes from the Latin word meaning "three days," and encompasses the three most sacred days in the Church year. The triduum begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday. The liturgical celebrations during the Triduum on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday are rich with symbolism and flow from one to another in a seamless way. While it may appear as if these liturgies are separate and distinct, they are actually intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all of the liturgies.

(Canons 97 & 1252)
