#### **DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION**

In today's Gospel we recount the story of Emmaus Road where Our Lord appeared to two of his disciples but they didn't recognize him. But actually, that's nothing new for Our Lord is it? Before the crucifixion, very few recognized him for who he really was; who he came to reveal himself to be – the Messiah, the Son of God. Sadly, even after the Resurrection, things hadn't changed much. Very few recognized him; very few remembered what he had said about being the Messiah.

But as he and the two disciples walked along, Jesus recounted to them all that the prophets had said about him, beginning with Moses. Why start with Moses? He was a mighty man of God, yes; he led Israel out of slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land, yes; but he wasn't a prophet was he? Actually, Moses was THE prophet who prophesied that God would send another one like him, the Messiah, to lead them to the heavenly promised land. In Deuteronomy 18:15 Moses prophesied: "A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kindred; that is the one to whom you shall listen." That's why when John the Baptist told the Scribes and Pharisees he was not Elijah, they immediately asked him, "Are you THE prophet?" That is, are you the New Moses, the Messiah that is to come? Again he denied it and pointed instead to Jesus. Now during Our Lord's ministry, there were those who recognized him as THE Prophet, the Messiah they had been waiting for. After the multiplication of the loaves, the people said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." At the Feast of Tabernacles, after teaching the people, they said, "Of a truth this is THE Prophet." You can see now why the Scribes and Pharisees were confused by Jesus – by this New Moses – who so often seemed to ignore the Law. Would THE Prophet, the New Moses, do this? In fact, Our Lord was showing them, as he said many times, that He was the fulfillment, the perfection, and the completion of the Law. The fact is, Our Lord fulfilled over 300 prophecies the Old Testament prophets made concerning the Messiah. This was what Our Lord must have explained to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is why their hearts were burning within them on the way. Their hearts responded to the Real Presence of Our Lord.

Let's explore the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist a bit – His Real Presence. Dr. Peter Kreeft, a Catholic philosopher, illustrates the Real Presence in this way. Let's say you and I know each other. We are walking in opposite directions on a busy sidewalk and I accidentally bump into you as we pass one another. I say a sincere, "Oh, I'm sorry" but since I didn't see your face, you are not really present to me even though you are physically present. You're not present to me because I don't know who it is I just bumped into! That means real presence – the real presence of a person – is not just a physical presence.

On the other hand, if I am thinking about you, even loving you, with both my will and my emotions, but you are thousands of miles away, that is not real presence either. You are physically absent, even though you can be said to be spiritually or mentally present. But even so, real presence cannot be just a mental presence, a presence in the mind and emotions. And neither is it a combination of the two. For if I believe you are a thousand miles away, and I am thinking of you and loving you, and I happen to bump into you in the street, but do not recognize it is you, that is not a real presence either, even though you are both physically and mentally present. Real presence, then, includes both physical and mental presence, but it also must be something more. I think part of the "something more" is recognition. Recognition of whose presence we are in. I didn't recognize it was you who I bumped into and so I missed your real presence.

As Catholics, we have been given the grace of faith whereby we recognize Our Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist. Now of course, He is there whether he is recognized or not: body, blood, soul and divinity, for his presence does not depend on us, but on the promise He made at the Last Supper: this is my body, this is my blood. Nevertheless, like when Mary Magdalene recognized Jesus in the garden, his Real Presence is only fully manifested to you and me when we behold him in the Eucharist with the eyes of faith. And our response to his Real Presence should be just like Mary Magdalene's: in joy and awe, we must fall at his feet, hold onto him, and never let him go!
