FR. ANGELO'S REFLECTION

In today's reading from John's gospel, Jesus and his disciples are gathered at the last supper meal. After washing the disciples' feet, he reveals some shocking news that Judas will betray him, Peter will deny him and that his time with them is almost over. Talk about some depressing news! Then Jesus tells his disciples they are to love one another as the distinguishing characteristic of their discipleship.

I can imagine the disciples were overwhelmed with all that Jesus had just spoken. No doubt they were confused, hurt, anxious, fearful, and maybe a bit hopeless. Jesus must have seen these emotions welling up in the eyes of the disciples. In an effort to comfort them Jesus then says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." These words have served as a source of comfort and support for the followers of Jesus throughout the centuries.

What does it mean for you to have a troubled heart? Maybe you would describe a troubled heart as being fearful, angry, stressed out, bitter or conflicted. You can tell someone has a troubled heart when they believe their life would be so much better if they could just change their situation; like a change in jobs would solve their problems or if they could just have a better house or if their family life could be different...then everything would be alright. Most parents experience a troubled heart as their child leaves the nest for college or for a job. A troubled heart wells up when the sparkle and gleam of your golden years has worn off and you experience more and more limitations in life. Many circumstances in life can lead to a troubled heart.

When the feeling of a troubled heart begins to stir within you Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." The peace that you seek will not be found outside of you. Dig deep within your heart and know that Jesus is the way and the truth and the life. As temples of God's spirit, we carry the presence of God within us all the time.

A troubled heart is a heart that relies only upon itself. As someone once noted, a troubled heart is like the "check engine" light going off in your car. When that light comes on you know your car needs attention. So too, when worry, fear or a troubled heart stirs within you it's time to re-evaluate your life of faith because you are no longer trusting in Jesus. A pure and undivided heart is a heart that trusts God in every way.

Jesus clearly says, "I am the way and the truth and the life." Reflecting on this message St. Thomas a Kempis once wrote, "Without the Way, there is no going. Without the Truth, there is no knowing. Without the Life, there is no living."

Jesus says that it is possible for our heart, which is the center of our existence, to retain its peace even during the storms and challenges of life. Consider what we do when a storm or tornado comes our way; we seek shelter somewhere in the center of the house. So too, in our lives of faith it is important for us to go to the center of our being, to our heart, that place where God is found and draw upon the resources and strength we need to make our way through the storm.

When confronted with troubles in life St. Peter offers us this advice, "Come to Christ, a living stone" and "let yourselves be built into a spiritual house." For the people of Israel, the Temple in Jerusalem was the place that most clearly reflected the heavenly Temple. Now, with Jesus, we see that he is the new Temple and we, his mystical body, are an extension of that Temple. When our hearts at peace they can become a place of healing, a place of right relations and a place of instruction for others to come and experience God's presence on earth.

In this Easter season bring your troubled heart to the Lord and allow him to be the way and the truth and the life for you as you journey in faith, keeping in your heart a longing for that promised dwelling place God is preparing for all who believe. Ask yourself, do the things I worry about really deserve so much of my time and energy? Hear Jesus say to you, "Do not let your hearts be troubled, have faith in God, have faith in me."


