DEACON RUSTY'S REFLECTION

To see how the readings are tied together today, we need to understand where Israel is with respect to their exodus from Egypt. In fact, they are very early in their journey across the desert, for it has only been a few weeks since God saved them from 400 years of slavery in Egypt. Here at Mt. Sinai, they will soon receive the 10 Commandments, but that hasn't happened yet. What is happening is that God, through Moses, is reminding the people who they are and what He has just delivered them from, but even more importantly, He reveals to them what He has delivered them for, saying, "...you [are] my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." Why a kingdom of priests? Why a holy nation? This kingdom of priests, this holy nation was to call all God's children back to their loving Father, for they were all dear to Him! It was through what we might call the common priesthood of all Israel that this was to be done.

But at the same time God also established what we would call a ministerial priesthood to serve the common priesthood. Men from the tribe of Levi would offer sacrifice at the altar with Moses' brother Aaron serving as the first high priest. Other men from Levi, though not priests, would assist them at the altar. Thus, we find the genesis, if you will, of the three-fold hierarchy of men ordained into Holy Orders in the Catholic Church with bishops and priests constituting the ministerial priesthood, assisted by deacons, as well as the common priesthood of all the baptized. Within the Church Our Lord founded, then, just like in Old Testament Israel, we find a "kingdom of priests." But priests of the New Covenant, of the New Israel as the Church has often and rightly been called throughout its history. And in the Gospel today we see those Our Lord chose as Apostles – the first bishops of the Church.

Now with regard to Holy Orders, there is something many people miss or perhaps have never been told. Men in Holy Orders, that is, bishops and priests who make up the ministerial priesthood, as well as deacons who assist them, are at the service of the common priesthood. Our vocation is for service. That is, the purpose of our ordination, the focus of our ministry, our mission, if you will, is directed at the unfolding; the releasing of the grace you all possess by virtue of your baptism, so that you might live a life of faith, hope, and charity, a life according to the Spirit; so that you might form a holy nation. Why? Well, consider this: it was through water that Israel was saved from slavery in Egypt; but they weren't just saved from something, they were also saved for something. We too were saved through the waters of our baptism saved from sin. And we too weren't just saved from something, we were also saved for something, namely to place our lives at the service of the Gospel for the sake of the world. That is the vocation of all the baptized. At our baptism, we were anointed priest, prophet, and king, that we might do what priests do: which is offer sacrifice; that we might do what prophets do: which is to proclaim the truth, and that we might do what kings do: which is to rule. We do this for the sake of souls.

Now, monks and nuns do all this in the solitude of their monasteries and convents, whereas we are called to do this in the midst of the world. Personally, I think it's a toss-up which is the more difficult place to do this – each has its own unique challenges. But I take comfort in the fact that St. Teresa of Avila once told her sisters: "Do you think, my daughters, that it is an easy matter to have to do business with the world, to live in the world, to engage in the affairs of the world, and, as I have said, to live as worldly men do, and yet inwardly to be strangers to the world, and enemies of the world, like persons who are in exile – to be, in short, not men but angels?"

It goes without saying that we need all the graces we can get to live as we are called to! We simply cannot do this on our own – and we should not try! That is why we so need the sacraments, so that we can fulfill our baptismal vocation. And so I ask you, fellow priests of the Lord, to join with me in fervent prayer not only for each other and our vocations, but also for vocations to the ministerial priesthood, for it is only through their priestly ministry that we have the sacraments which give us the grace to live out our vocation for the sake of the world; it is only through the grace of the sacraments that we can become "a kingdom of priests, and a holy nation."
