

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday in preparation for Holy Week. On this weekend we hold palms in our hands and hear the Gospel reading of The Passion of Christ. What seems odd is that these two huge events in the Bible actually mirror each other as complete opposites.

In the east, we have Jesus coming down from the Mount of Olives into the small village of Bethany with His disciples. We hear that Jesus sends two disciples ahead to go into the city to retrieve a donkey that has never been sat upon. After mounting the colt, He rides alone into the city where He is greeted by a large crowd holding branches and laid down cloaks in front of Him. It is a joyful display of the Jewish people welcoming a man that they thought might redeem them from the Roman occupation.

In the west, we have Pontius Pilate riding on a chariot, accompanied by a huge military presence. His entourage came from Caesarea Maritima, the Roman enclave on the Mediterranean coast, about 60 miles and a three day's journey west of Jerusalem. He only comes to Jerusalem when he must. He has to come to Jerusalem for the Passover, not for religious reasons, but for a show of force.

This morning's Gospel illustrates one person of authority giving in to another power for the salvation of the world. Pontius Pilate asks Jesus if He is a king, and Jesus acknowledges that He is a Ruler of another Kingdom. Jews come from far and wide to celebrate their ancestors' complete annihilation of the powerful army of their Egyptian oppressors and await another Messiah. There was a Roman opinion that there were enough crazies out there that someone may claim to be this king in their religious fervor. This holiday in particular makes the Roman authorities nervous. Pilate couldn't afford to let something like that happen and so, after interrogation, gives in to the rioting crowds to have Jesus crucified.

This weekend we stand to hear the Gospel with palms in our hands just like Jesus' disciples did as they shouted "Hosanna in the highest" as He passed by. It is a true witness of Palm Sunday, and we begin to realize that Jesus was completing His journey like "a lamb being lead to slaughter" for the salvation of the world.

The palm branches that we hold in our hand are pagan Grecian Olympian symbols for goodness and victory. They become sacramentals to remind us of that day when Jesus entered Jerusalem to save the world.

This is the reason we carry blessed Palm branches on this Sunday, and stand to hear how eternal life began in the city of Jerusalem over two thousand years ago at two separate gates, and ended on a hill named Calvary.





March: Mary's First Moments with Jesus

Relevant Scripture: Luke 1: 26-37

In this moment, the miracle of life has been revolutionized again. At the beginning of time, God the Father had spoken the words, "Let there be light," and so it had come to be. Now, as creation reaches for its pinnacle, the Word of God made flesh is conceived and brought into the world of creation through the words of a teenage girl. Mary said, "Let it be done to me according to your word." In this moment, the world's true light has already come into our existence. He comes not as a conquering king, not as a noble child, not even as the infant in swaddling clothes. He comes first and foremost in the form of a single fragile cell of humanity, wrapped securely inside the warmth of His mother's body.

He is so small that even if He were not inside His mother's womb, He would not be identifiable to the naked eye. He is so helpless, that the setting in which He currently resides is the only one capable of sustaining His life. Yet, He is already wholly and utterly the God-man, destined to save all of humanity through His love and His sacrifice. People will speak of His first 30 years on earth as the hidden time of His life because it comes before His public ministry. During those many years, only His parents, relatives, and perhaps a few neighbors will benefit from His daily presence.

But in truth, these moments are the most hidden of the Messiah's life. For these moments in the womb are preserved even from His family and His earthly father. This time is preserved such that only His mother can share the precious time with Him. In some ways, He feels further away to Mary than He will after His birth. For she cannot hug and kiss Him, she cannot clean His face, or tousle His hair as she rocks Him to sleep. Yet, in other ways, these are the most intimate moments that any human being will ever have with the God of the Universe. She rubs the side of her stomach affectionately, though of course His one cell does not yet feel it physically. She smiles and feels no fear.

Mary turns her thoughts to the other women who have experienced pregnancy like this. Of course, no one else has conceived God in their womb, but countless other women have found themselves pregnant and alone. She thinks of Joseph, her betrothed. Would he understand? Would he still want to marry

Disciple Maker Index Results

For St. Gaspar Family of Parishes

The 2023 DMI study undertaken by the St Gaspar Family of Parishes showed that the majority of responders agree that the church is the primary place to worship, and that the Eucharist is the body and blood of Jesus Christ. Most responders attend weekly Mass and believe that scripture is the word of God. However, the majority disagrees that the parish equips them to confidently answer questions about faith and religion, invite young people to join the priesthood or consecrated life, and that the parish forms them as a disciple of Christ.

The majority felt that the main drivers for them to recommend a parish was the pastor (15.0 X – strongly agree and agree versus disagree), followed by welcoming atmosphere (8.4X), the preaching(5.5X) the Sunday Mass experience(3.5x) and easy to find information (16X). The majority agreed the main drivers that help them grow as Catholics are the Pastor 14.5 X, welcoming atmosphere (10X), preaching (15X), easy to find information (14.6X) and Sunday Mass experience (4.5X)

The majority of the responders were white, married, members for more than 10 years, involved in multiple parish activities, and 55 or older. Most did not send their kids to catholic school.
