

Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

From hymnary.org: "In the mid-nineteenth century, Bishop John William Colenso of Natal raised a ruckus in the Catholic Church when he challenged the historicity and authority of many of the Old Testament books. Bishop Gray of Capetown wrote a stirring response of defense, which, in 1866, inspired Samuel Stone, to write this beloved hymn." Interestingly, Mr. Stone was not a Catholic, but an Anglican clergyman. We sing these words, which emphasize Christian unity in Jesus Christ, to the familiar tune "Aurelia" (meaning "golden") by S. S. Wesley.



Emmanuel Pro Life Pamphlet Rack "Trot Out a Toddler"

The "Trot Out a Toddler" approach to discussing abortion with those who support it for pragmatic reasons is described in chapter 3 of Trent Horn's book Persuasive Pro-Life. Many of the

arguments used to support abortion (such as poverty, choice, women's rights) can be used just as logically to support killing a toddler. Asking if killing a two-year old in the same circumstances is OK can lead to a discussion of the key issue – what is an aborted child.

There are many other erroneous reasons for supporting abortion (such as tolerance, skepticism about when a new human life begins, defining "person" to exclude the unborn, bodily autonomy), and Persuasive Pro-Life presents approaches for dealing with them. Please borrow a copy of the book from the pro-life pamphlet rack in the back of Emmanuel church to learn more.

Less Stairs, More "Welcome!"

On June 27, we held a ribbon-cutting to celebrate the opening of a 6,500 square foot addition to our building at 922 West Riverview Avenue in Dayton. A key element of our new and improved facility is a ground-level **Welcome Center**, which is much more than just a fancy new front door!



structure required visitors to climb 13 steps just to get to the door. The new Welcome Center entry is at street-level and adjacent to a brand new elevator that makes all levels of our building fully accessible.

But what makes our new Welcome Center a true resource to the community is that the front desk is staffed from 8:30am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday by a combination of volunteers, interns and staff who can provide information and guidance to those looking

Ohio 24-Hour Abortion Waiting Period

Under Legal Attack

as Feared by Amendment Opponents

The fears of anti-abortion advocates in Ohio are being realized as abortion rights supporters challenge the state's 24-hour waiting period rule as at odds with the abortion rights amendment enshrined into the state constitution last fall.

The fight comes following the passage of a sweeping abortion rights amendment into the state constitution during the November 2023 election that prohibits the state from acting "directly or indirectly [to] burden, penalize or interfere with or discriminate against" a citizen's reproductive choices, allowing abortion until fetal viability. The lawsuit against the 24-hour waiting period was launched in March, with new court documents filed Monday presenting the argument that the wait time and the requirement for two in-person appointments prior to an abortion creates an undue burden for patients. . .Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost has said many of the arguments against the 24-hour waiting period as creating an undue burden are not due to the mandate themself, but rather are "attributable to several factors outside of the state's control."

The abortion debate in Ohio drew national attention last year following two statewide referenda related to abortion rights. The first, in August 2023, was a referendum regarding whether to increase the popular vote necessary to pass a constitutional amendment via referendum. It did not pass. The second, in November, was on the amendment itself, which passed with a simple majority vote. . .enshrined into the state constitution the right for every individual to "make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions," which includes but is not limited to contraception, fertility treatments, miscarriage care, and abortion. . .During the ballot initiative campaign, anti-abortion advocates said passing the amendment would eventually nullify several of the state's regulations on abortion, including the 24-hour waiting period.

Other laws that could face legal challenges include Ohio's parental consent requirements for minors to obtain abortion procedures as well as safety regulations for abortion clinics, such as distance from an emergency medicine facility. The state's so-called heartbeat law, which would have prohibited abortions after six weeks gestation following the detection of a heartbeat, was struck down by the state Supreme Court in December following the passage of the amendment...

The majority of states, 28 in all, have waiting periods of 24 hours or more prior to receiving an abortion. . .Of these, 16 states require one in-person visit to the abortion facility prior to receiving the procedure. Only 13 of the states with 24-hour waiting periods have a near-total abortion ban
