

Solemnity of St. Gaspar

October 21, 2024

This weekend, the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes celebrates the Feast Day of St. Gaspar del Bufalo, founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. While many know the feast falls on October 21, this date wasn't always its official celebration. Initially, the Missionaries celebrated it on several different dates, including January and June. In 1962, to avoid conflicting with other feasts and holidays, the Missionaries obtained approval to observe it on October 21, which was later adopted by the Diocese of Rome in 1973.

Why October 21?

The decision to celebrate on October 21 also had pastoral reasons. October provided more favorable weather for those attending celebrations, especially students at institutions directed by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Additionally, October was significant in St. Gaspar's personal life, as both his parents passed away around this time. This date became a fitting tribute to a man who dedicated his life to missionary work.

Special Readings this Weekend

The readings for this weekend's Mass, chosen from the Solemnity of St. Gaspar, are used by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood worldwide. As the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes is ministered to by these Missionaries, this feast day holds special significance for our six parishes. Let us celebrate St. Gaspar's legacy and reflect on his devotion to Christ's Precious Blood.

Quotable St. Gaspar

Saint Gaspar del Bufalo is known for his quote, "I would rather die or suffer any evil than take such an oath. I cannot, I will not, I must not". He said this in 1810 when he was brought before a magistrate to swear allegiance to Napoleon. Gaspar refused to betray the Pope and was exiled to a prison in Piacenza, Italy.

Respect Life Month

"I Came So That They May Have Life"

Respect Life Reflection

Part of the impetus for the Eucharistic Revival was a concern that some Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. Even though our human senses perceive bread and wine, the Eucharist is Jesus—body, blood, soul, and divinity. Similarly, many people do not realize or acknowledge the sanctity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that may not be perceivable through our human senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.

We live in a society that rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable. Yet, it is precisely within these conditions that a person is most in need of our care and protection. Pope Francis reminds us that "every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world's rejection."

The U.S. bishops have affirmed that, while it is important to address all the ways in which human life is threatened, "abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone." [emphasis added]

As Pope St. John Paul II wrote, "we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the 'culture of death' and the 'culture of life'. ...we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life."

In the face of challenges such as abortion and physician-assisted suicide, we may feel that we are not equal to the task of overcoming the darkness. Yet, we are not alone. Jesus tells us, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). The God who became man to save us still dwells among us. For Christ is "the light [that] shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5). He is the one who overcame death and continually raises us to new life. He remains close to us always, seeking us out in each moment of our lives. Jesus gave his very flesh to give us the gift of eternal life and invites us to the most profound experience of this gift in our celebration of the Eucharist. When we meet Jesus in the Eucharist, this encounter has the power to change us. The Eucharist has the power to transform the depths of our hearts and the heart of our culture. United to the power of his Eucharistic Presence, may we work to ensure that each person has life—and has it in Abundance.






