

Pastor's Desk

In today's gospel, we see the transfiguration of Jesus Christ. Jesus is portrayed in dazzling white. He is speaking to Moses, who represents the law, the ten commandments. He is also speaking to Elijah. Elijah represents the prophets and how Jesus is both the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. Peter, James, and John see this dazzling spectacle and Peter tells Jesus that he wants to build three tents. "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But he did not know what he was saving. While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

Peter wants to stay on the mountain. He wants to stay in that spiritual ecstasy. But that is not the way of discipleship. It is good that we pray and go to Eucharistic adoration and adore our Lord in the Eucharist. But we have to leave there and be Christ to others.

That is why Peter did not know what he was saying, as we hear in today's gospel.

Then we hear God, the Father, testifying about who Jesus is. "This is my chosen son; listen to Him." Peter, James, and John see the miracles of Jesus. They also hear God, the Father, acknowledging Jesus as His son. But they still doubt and fall short of being Jesus' apostles. This is the human condition. You and I have that same human condition. It is still lent. Don't give up because of your lack of faith also.

Lent is a time to grow and understand your weaknesses.

That sounds different...

@Precious Blood, St. Paul, and St. Rita

Have you noticed a change in some of the acclamations we sing at Mass? Well, there's a reason. Different liturgical seasons bring about changes in ritual music. Some of the changes include Mass settings, which include the Gloria (omitted during Lent and Advent-except for the Feast of the Immaculate

Conception), Penitential Litany, Gospel Acclamations, and the Eucharistic Acclamations. Musicians typically switch Mass settings and other acclamations when there is a change in liturgical seasons. Just as meteorological seasons have a different feel, so too, does the liturgical seasons. For example, some acclamations during Lent and Advent may be composed in a minor key, which has a somber or melancholy feeling. In Ordinary Time (particularly the summer months), I may select a Mass setting composed in a major key. The liturgical cycles (ABC) may also have an influence when selecting service music. So if you notice a change in our sung acclamations, it's likely there was a change in liturgical season or cycle.
