

Statement from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, Release date: April 21, 2025

Mourning the death of Pope Francis

Today, Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of Cincinnati join Catholics and all people of faith around the world in praying for the soul of the Holy Father, Pope Francis. The Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati mourns his recent death.

Most Reverend Robert G. Casey, Archbishop of Cincinnati, has released the following statement upon the death of Pope Francis:

"As we commend a good and faithful servant to God, let us remember that Pope Francis proclaimed 2025 as a Jubilee Year of Hope — awakening us to Christ, who is alive and present in our midst. In the words of the Psalmist: "Hope in the Lord! Hold firm, take heart, and hope in the Lord!" (Psalm 27:14).

May we, then, be filled with hope — hope that Pope Francis will receive the reward of a life poured out in selfless service and love for God's people and all creation; hope that Christ, who comforts us in our mourning, will send the Holy Spirit to be our Helper; and hope that this same Spirit will inspire and unite us as the Church to stand firm in faith, proclaiming the power of the Resurrection and the joy of the Gospel."

Most Reverend Dennis M. Schnurr, Archbishop Emeritus of Cincinnati, has released the following statement upon the death of Pope Francis:

"Please join me in praying for the repose of the soul of our beloved Pope Francis, who was Vicar of Christ, the successor of St. Peter and a faithful shepherd of Christ's Church. The Holy Father will long be remembered for his great compassion for the elderly, the sick, the unborn, the persecuted and all those on the margins of society. He continuously reminded us that we are the stewards of God's creation and not its master. And he was an unwavering champion of world peace. After a life dedicated to proclaiming the Good News of our Lord's saving love for us, may Pope Francis now inherit the reward of eternal rest with God."





Ohio Pro-Life Laws Steadily Being Nullified by Issue 1



A local judge has permanently blocked an Ohio law requiring fetal or embryonic remains from surgical abortions to be cremated or buried, ruling it violates the constitutional amendment protecting reproductive rights that Ohio voters approved in 2023 (Issue 1).

The recent decision by Hamilton County Judge Alison Hatheway came in a case brought by a group of clinics and the ACLU of Ohio. An earlier iteration of the legal challenge had argued that a lack of rules, including whether a death certificate would be required, made complying with the law "impossible."

Dayton Right to Life and other prolife groups worked on this legislation for over 3 years. It passed the Ohio legislature and was signed by the Governor in 2020. This is just one of numerous Ohio abortion laws that courts have blocked as a result of the 2023 amendment that codified a so-called, "right to abortion" in the Ohio Constitution.

Last August, Franklin County Judge David C. Young temporarily blocked several state laws that combined to create a 24-hour waiting period for obtaining an abortion in the state. Then, in September, Hatheway blocked two more abortion laws impacted by the vote: a ban on the use of telemedicine for medication abortions and one prohibiting non-doctors — including midwives, advanced practice nurses and physician assistants — from

prescribing the abortion pill mifepristone. In October, Hamilton County Judge Christian Jenkins struck down Ohio's Heartbeat law, which protected babies after a fetal heartbeat detection.

So, it seems the voters of Ohio are getting exactly the kind of laws they wanted. In spite of this we must recognize that the fight to protect life is ultimately not about changing laws. Rather, it is a moral and spiritual fight to change hearts and minds, to bring about a true culture of life.

Discover true love.

At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus met Peter, James, and John by the seashore, filling their nets to overflowing. They left their boats behind, awestruck and hopeful. After the resurrection, confused and out of sorts, the apostles returned to their fishing boats, seeking security in their previous way of life. They encountered Jesus on the seashore again, their fishing net and their hearts overflowing anew.

Even though the disciples had journeyed with Jesus for three years, he still had much to teach them about forgiveness, mercy, and love. Peter had denied Jesus during his passion; others had walked away, hidden,

fearful. Jesus did not come to condemn them, however. He came with love, seeking love. "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Jesus asked. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (Jn 21:15, 13:35)

Allow the Lord to come to you with love. Jesus sacrificed himself, giving himself completely so that God's love might be known. Listen to the gospels as though it's the first time you're hearing them and be awestruck by the miracle of Christ's undying love for all.

The love we encounter in Jesus is not easy, feel-good love, like young infatuation. Rather, the love of Christ is deep, unshakable, true. Jesus reveals God who is love: "God's very being is love. By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret. God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange." (CCC, 221)

Thank God for the gift of love through sharing and caring. Jesus asks, "Do you love me?" Respond to Christ's love in gratitude by putting love into action, especially for those who are poor, lonely, frightened, and sick.

Give yourself away.

There the cross is found, because the cross is our desire to give ourselves away. It is our hunger to genuinely hand ourselves over, to give ourselves to others, because it is in doing so that we are most who we are. If you hold onto your life, you will

not have life, but if you give it away, you cannot exhaust life. It becomes everlasting life. You become absolutely you.

And who, finally, are you?
You are the image and likeness of God. If God is pure self-gift, then self-gift is the image in which we are made, the blueprint on which we are built. Therefore, to give ourselves away is what we most deeply desire."






