

Staff Reflection

The Ascension of the Lord and the Church's Call to Renewal

As I reflect on the Feast of the Ascension, I can't help but think about how it speaks to the changes many of us are experiencing in our parishes right now—especially with initiatives like Beacons of Light and the Next Generation Parish model. With over 20 years working in church operations, I've seen a lot of transition, but something about this moment feels deeper, more like a shift than just another change.

The Ascension of the Lord is one of those beautiful but challenging events in our faith. Jesus physically leaves His disciples, and you can almost feel their confusion—maybe even their fear. They're left staring at the sky, wondering what comes next. I've felt that way in parish life more than once. We want to cling to what we've known, especially if it's worked in the past.

But the message is clear: Don't just stand there. There's work to do. With Beacons of Light, parishes are being asked to come together, to share resources, and to reimagine how we serve our communities, not just to survive, but to become more vibrant and mission-driven. It's not always easy. There's grief involved when structures shift. But like the disciples, we're being asked to trust that the Holy Spirit will lead us forward.

The Next Generation Parish approach picks up that same theme. It's about helping our parishes become places where people don't just attend Mass, but grow as disciples. That means lay people (like many of us) are being called to step up, lead in new ways, and help shape what parish life looks like moving forward.

And here's the good news: Jesus promises to be with us. Even as He ascends, He's not stepping away—He's stepping ahead, leading us into something new.

I believe this is a time of letting go, waiting with hope, and stepping out with courage. The Ascension reminds us that faith is not about staying still or preserving what's familiar. It's about movement, mission, and trust.




@Holy Trinity and Emmanuel



"Behold ... to Be Held"

The Quiet Stillness of Contemplation

"Rising very early before dawn, Jesus left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed."

(St. Mark 1:35)

This week, our Encounter Team focuses on contemplation as a form of prayer - which is completely surrendering ourselves into a deep communion with our good and loving God. According to St. Teresa of Avila, contemplative prayer "is nothing else than a close sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us." Contemplation is a form of wordless prayer in which our mind and heart are focused on the awesome greatness and goodness of God in silent and loving adoration. We turn over our heart to deeply contemplate the overwhelming love of God revealed in His Son, Jesus Christ in His Life, Death, and Resurrection. As the phrase quoted above succinctly states: we "behold the all-encompassing love, mercy, and tenderness of God in silent and guiet adoration to be gently held by this infinite and awesome Love." We are like a little child who cries out: "Rather, I have stilled my soul, like a weaned child in its mother's lap, so weaned is my soul" (Psalm 131:2).

Contemplation requires our willingness to abandon ourselves in stillness, quiet, and silence. In our busy and noisy lives this abandonment is a "wilderness" that our loving God constantly invites us to enter into and breathe freely within.

"One form of contemplation is the Centering Prayer, in which you make use of a "sacred word" such as Jesus, Love, Peace - or a sacred icon or image - in a unique way, as a focus point to attain inner silence and stillness.

At the point that we find our attention slipping to other thoughts or distractions, we simply return to our sacred word or icon, with no judgement. As we grow in our ability to quiet ourselves, we then 'center' ourselves and quietly rest in God's sacred Presence" (Susannah Kelly, with the Jesuit Spiritual Center of Milford, Ohio).

There are other forms of contemplation including Eucharistic Adoration and night-time vigils. Please see our "nudges" and options offered here.

We invite you to cry out to the Holy Spirit again, to move your heart and soul into this "inner sanctuary" of God's loving and sacred Presence. Come, O Holy Spirit, come! Renew the hearts of your faithful ones!

Emmanuel's Corpus Christi Mass and Procession is Saturday, June 21 with Mass at 5:00 pm, followed by the outdoor Eucharistic procession. A potluck dinner will follow the procession – everyone is invited!

According to <u>CatholicCulture.org</u>, the tradition of the Corpus Christi procession began in the 14th century, when townspeople would honor the Blessed Sacrament with a splendid procession after Mass. By the later Middle Ages, these events became beautiful public pageants of faith and devotion. At Emmanuel, we've proudly carried on this tradition for over 20 years. Every year, our parish decorates the streets in honor of Our Lord in the Eucharist, using dyed wood chips to create stunning artwork.

This tradition is especially joyful for the children who help design and dye the chips.

False Claim: Women will Die if Abortion is made Illegal

A 23-page guide from the National Right to Life Committee, When They Say. . . You Say, lays out detailed refutations to five categories of proabortion arguments. The fourth category of arguments for abortion rely upon the false claim that illegal abortions result in thousands of maternal deaths. The best refutation of this comes from abortionists themselves. As early as 1960, Dr. Mary S. Calderone, a former Planned Parenthood director, wrote that "[a]bortion is no longer a dangerous procedure. This applies not just to therapeutic abortions as performed in hospitals but also the so-called illegal abortions as done by physicians." Dr. Bernard Nathanson, former director of the National Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws wrote in 1979 that he knew their claims of 5.000 to 10.000 maternal deaths a year due to abortion "were totally false". Per the Centers for Disease Control, in 1972, the year before Roe vs. Wade was decided, there were 39 maternal deaths from abortion. According to the World Health Organization, in 2017 Ireland had one of the lowest maternal death rates in the world, despite abortion being illegal at that time, whereas in the U.S., with legal abortion, the maternal death rate was four times that of Ireland. Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

The 16th-century English composer Thomas Tallis, whose name appeared in this space recently, once again gives us music for today, this time as the tune for "O Holy Spirit, Come to Us." The ancient text, Veni Creator Spiritus (from the 9th century), was translated for today's hymn by Melvin Farrell (1930-1986), a priest of the Society of St. Sulpice. While still a seminarian, he worked with a fellow student on preparing a hymnal which was published as The People's Hymnal. After long years devoted to preparing seminarians for the priesthood in the turbulent years of the mid-20th century, Fr. Farrell succumbed to cancer, writing, "Our faith in God's providence assures us that he is with us. Even the hairs on our heads are numbered."


