

The Most Holy Trinity

a Divine Love Affair!

This weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We all know the doctrine of the Trinity: God is one God in three divine persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This doctrine is pervasive in our theology, liturgy, and customs. How do we begin and end every prayer? In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit; we are baptized in the same way; Mass begins and ends similarly. It's not an overstatement to say that the Trinity permeates every aspect of our faith, and yet the doctrine remains an impenetrable mystery for many. It will always be a mystery, of course, but we can penetrate it a bit by not treating the doctrine as if it were the Trinity. The doctrine is simply what we must accept as true about the Trinity ... it is NOT the Trinity itself. The Trinity is not something like a doctrine. The Trinity is three divine persons; someone if you will. And the blessed in heaven will spend all eternity communing with and contemplating the eternal splendor of the Most Holy Trinity.

And speaking of eternity did you ever wonder what God "did" before He created the universe, before he created time itself? Nothing? Hardly! He loved. At the core of the mystery of the Holy Trinity is a divine, eternal love story that precedes creation; a love story because God is the very source of love. God is lover.

Before he created the world and throughout all eternity the Father loves the Son and the Son loves the Father. And from that love between divine persons comes an eternal, divine person; like the Father and the Son without beginning and without end, proceeding from the love between Father and Son. We call this divine person the Holy Spirit. One in being and essence with the Father and the Son.

Together they form a divine triune community of love. That is God's life work – to love, and to love infinitely. That is what He did before the world began; that is what He will ever do. And we have been invited to join this community of love for all eternity!

Why We Genuflect and Bow


Answer: In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), the Church specifies when the clergy and lay faithful should genuflect and/or bow during Mass and outside of Mass:


A genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

During Mass, three genuflections are made by the priest celebrant: namely, after the showing of the Host, after the showing of the chalice, and before Communion. Certain specific features to be observed in a concelebrated Mass are noted in their proper place (cf. nos. GIRM 210-251).

If, however, the tabernacle with the Most Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary, the priest, the deacon, and the other ministers genuflect when they approach the altar and when they depart from it, but not during the celebration of Mass itself.

Otherwise [i.e., outside of Mass,] all who pass before the Most Blessed Sacrament genuflect, unless they are moving in procession. Ministers carrying the processional cross or candles bow their heads instead of genuflecting (GIRM 274, emphasis added).



Consecration means "to make holy." When one makes an act of consecration, it is ultimately made to God with the understanding that our consecration is a serious commitment on our part to respond faithfully to God's grace at work in our lives.

This sixth week, our Encounter Team focuses on a special and grace-filled form of prayer in which a baptized Christian person or group of believers deliberately and fervently makes a heartfelt commitment to God to live out our Catholic Christian discipleship and Faith in a deep and life-changing way. We consecrate ourselves to our good and tender God, and we set ourselves aside and ask the Holy Spirit to make us holy. The fire and Divine Love of the Holy Spirit anoints us in holiness and in truth. Truly, it is the Holy Spirit who consecrates us - after we offer to Him our humble prayer to be set aside for a more intense life in Christ.

Consecrations can be made directly to the Holy Spirit, to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ, or to God the Father. In these consecrations, we make a serious, complete and ongoing submission to God's holy Will and to His paths for our life - and our Gospel mission. These consecrations are renewed daily even more frequently - as we are "nudged" and inspired by the Spirit of God.

Consecrations can be offered to Mary, the Mother of God under her many titles, and to St. Joseph, the guardian of the Holy Family. We prayerfully ask them to offer our lives, our hearts, and our every breath to God – that He may set us aside to live our Christian life in a deeper way. They intercede for us.

God is always the source of our intense desire to be consecrated - and to submit ourselves to His Life and Love. He only asks for our abandonment to His Grace. Alleluia !!!

Come, O Holy Spirit of the Living God – consecrate us in Truth! Amen.

In the Roman Catholic Church, the act of consecration can be applied to a bishop, a fixed altar, an altar stone, a church, and a chalice and paten. During Mass, the consecration refers to the moment when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. An act of consecration can also refer to a collective dedication or entrustment, which is meant to be a reminder to the faithful to the Gospel and to ask for effective intercession on behalf of those in need.
