

Pastor's Desk

Today we will learn about angels, Saint Peter, and Saint Paul. In the first reading, we see Peter escaping prison. An angel of the Lord saves Peter and allows him to escape persecution. You and I have guardian angels. These angels are given to us from the time of our conception until we go to heaven. Our guardian angel is with us even in purgatory. Angels are spiritual beings and messengers sent by God to assist us and pray for us. Angels are not human beings. Make it a habit to pray to your angel each day. Thank your angel and bless your angel each day.

Today Paul tells us how he has competed well in the life of faith. He ran the race that God gave him. Paul is now waiting to be executed by Caesar. This may seem tragic but Paul has followed the Lord's command and has made disciples for Christ. Paul's death does not mean that he is a failure. It means that he is a martyr and has followed Christ. Paul has evangelized and spread the gospel. All of us who are baptized are called to do the same.

In the gospel, Jesus calls Peter rock. Jesus appoints Peter to be the head of the church. Jesus tells Peter and the apostles to forgive sins in Jesus's name. Jesus chooses to work through human beings to minister to the world. That is Jesus's choice. He can do what he wants. You and I are called to follow and respect the teachings that God has given us. The commands he has given us. We have to believe all the Catholic Church teaches. Sometimes people think that they will follow the Catholic Church only when the Catholic Church does what I want. You may be waiting a long time. Jesus and his church has a mission. We are called to be a part of that mission like Saint Peter and Saint Paul.





"Jesus said to them, 'Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest for a while.' For people were coming and going in great numbers, and the disciples had no opportunity even to eat."

(St. Mark 6:31)

This week our Encounter Team will focus on a very special way to spiritually, physically and emotionally abandon ourselves into God's loving Heart and hands. A way for us to go out into a "deserted place" of silence, quiet stillness and an "aridness" in terms of sights, busyness, human interaction and our ever-present social media distractions. Retreats are offered to women and men - both lay and religious/clergy - to "come away" for a time, to allow the Holy Spirit to guide us and to re-center us on the Heart of Christ. Retreats can be over a longer three day weekend, an entire week, thirty days, or even longer in terms of a lengthy sabbatical. Retreats can be silent or open to discussion with a mentor or retreat director. They are offered for individuals, married couples and youth/college age students.

Some forms of retreats are: the Ignatian Spiritual Examen offered by the Jesuits, based on the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola who focuses on the "light" and "darkness" in one's life as "guides" for us amidst the "nudges" of the Holy Spirit; the Trappist or Cistercian retreat, such as that offered at the Abbey of Gethsemani in Kentucky, in which simplicity, "hiddenness," work and prayer are emphasized; and the Francisan Retreats offered in the spirit and "odor" of the writings, prayers and simple life of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Clare of Assisi. There are many other forms of retreats offered by religious orders and spiritual centers around the country.

I have attended a yearly, three day weekend retreat with my grandfathers, father, uncles, cousins and my two brothers at the Jesuit Spiritual Center in Milford, Ohio for over 35 years now: https://jesuitspiritualcenter.com. This extremely rich and silent "going away" for a time has been enlivening and spiritually challenging for me over these many years. I have gained much wisdom, grace-filled periods of quiet meditation, and merciful, gentle healing from our good God. My spiritual retreat directors have taught me the sheer beauty of holy Scripture - especially of the Gospel Good News. I have opened my heart and spirit to these directors - who in turn have led me to go deeper into the mystery of our God. The silence and the stillness of this retreat in the midst of astounding nature surrounding the Jesuit Spiritual Center feeds me and quenches my thirst for the Holy One. Our Encounter Team challenges you to prayerfully consider making a retreat. Jesus will reward you with grace, love and tender mercy.

Before the Retreat

- Set a clear intention Decide what you are hoping to receive whether it be peace, direction, healing, or a deeper connection with God.
- Pray for openness Ask the Holy Spirit to prepare your heart.
- Unplug Plan to disconnect from devices and social media so you can fully participate.

During the Retreat

- Embrace silence Lean into the silence to help you hear God's voice more clearly.
- Participate fully Even if something stretches you (group sharing, meditations, etc.) try to remain open.
- Journal your thoughts Write about insights, reflections, and what you feel God is saying to you.

After the Retreat

- Make a resolution What small action will you bring home with you. A new prayer habit? Reconciliation with someone?
- Share with a spiritual friend Sharing about your experience can help you clarify and solidify it.
- Ease back in Don't rush back into a busy routine. Stay prayerful and quiet for as long as you can afterward.

Emmanuel's Bake Sale a success!


