
Class fees are \$85 per child before Sept 21st and \$95 after Sept 21st. There is a max fee of \$300 per family.

ECC high school youth are channeled into Emmanuel's St. Romanos Choir which has ten high school students singing in its ranks at Saturday Vigil and Sunday morning Masses. The ECC also helped direct some of its members into music school with at least two known currently serving as music directors in parishes afar, and many, many serving the church as cantors.
