A 23-page guide from the National Right to Life Committee, When They Say. . . You Say, lays out detailed refutations to five categories of proabortion arguments. The document concludes by addressing the status of abortion in the United States since the Dobbs decision overturned Roe vs. Wade. Unfortunately, Dobbs did notoutlaw abortion. Some states had laws against abortion that could not be enforced under Roe vs. Wade, or had passed trigger laws to make abortion illegal, and those laws can now be enforced. Some state legislatures quickly passed laws after Dobbs to either legalize or prohibit abortion, or (as occurred in Ohio) voters were convinced to protect abortion in state constitutions.

Abortion proponents have been using the similarity between treatments for miscarriage (when the unborn baby has already died) and induced abortion to scare people into believing abortion is needed to treat miscarriage. They also falsely claim that abortion is necessary to treat certain life-threatening conditions that can occur during pregnancy. In fact, sometimes medication is successful, and other times the mother must be separated from the child to save the mother's life. It is never necessary to intentionally kill the child as induced abortion does, even though if separation must occur before viability the child will die.

Some abortion proponents are even claiming abortion is a religious right, hoping to use laws protecting religious liberty to protect abortion. Despite Dobbs, there is still much work needed to protect mothers and babies from abortion. Work to provide both compassionate care and legal protection must continue.

Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

From Music Director Michele Carner

Scotsman Walter C. Smith (1824-1908) gives us today's entrance hymn, "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise." We sing it to the Welsh tune St. Denio (remember how Welsh tunes often outline the chords they are sung to? Maybe you can hear that here in the first two measures—listen for the upside-down "do-mi-sol" pattern). Based on a letter of St. Paul to Timothy, the text may actually be Paul's citation of a Christian hymn of that time—so now we sing "a hymn [built] upon a hymn." Noting the antiquity of these words, Fr. George Rutler adds, "If no hymn is immortal, this one comes close." (Source: Fr. Rutler, The Stories of Hymns).
